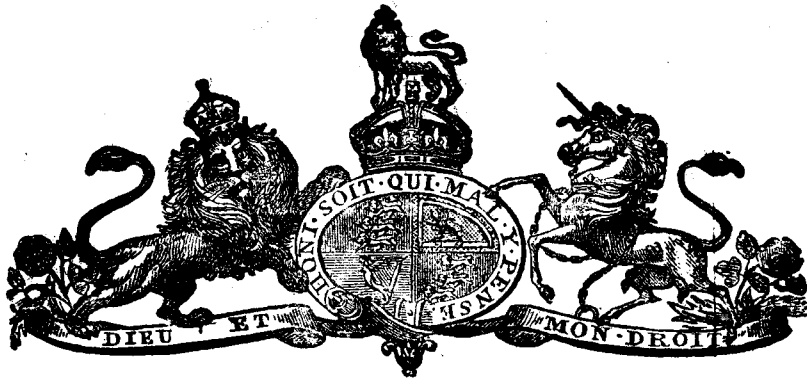

AN ACT to amend "The Midwifery Nurses  
Act, 1901."

[22 November, 1906.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Midwifery Nurses Amendment Act, 1906," and shall be construed as one with "The Midwifery Nurses Act, 1901."

2 Section Six of "The Midwifery Nurses Act, 1901," is hereby repealed, and the following Section substituted therefor:—

"6 Any woman—

i. Who holds a certificate in midwifery from some hospital, dispensary, or obstetrical society approved of by the Court, and who gives satisfactory proof of her good character; or

ii. Who, at the commencement of this Act, had been in actual practice in *Tasmania* as a midwife for a period of not less than One year—  
shall be entitled to have her name entered on the register and to receive a certificate of registration on payment of a fee of Two Shillings and Sixpence :” Provided that no woman shall be entitled to be registered pursuant to paragraph ii. of this Section after the Thirty-first day of *March*, One thousand nine hundred and seven.
