

AN ACT to amend "The Midwifery Nurses Act, 1901." [22 November, 1906.]

A.D. 1906.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Midwifery Nurses Amendment Short title and Act, 1906," and shall be construed as one with "The Midwifery incorporation with Nurses Act, 1901."

2 Section Six of "The Midwifery Nurses Act, 1901," is hereby repealed, and the following Section substituted therefor:-

"6 Any woman— 1. Who holds a certificate in midwifery from some hospital, registering dispensary, or obstetrical society approved of by the Court,

II. Who, at the commencement of this Act, had been in actual practice in *Tasmania* as a midwife for a period of not less than One year—

shall be entitled to have her name entered on the register and to receive a certificate of registration on payment of a fee of Two Shillings and Sixpence:" Provided that no woman shall be entitled to be registered pursuant to paragraph 11. of this Section after the Thirty-first day of *March*, One thousand nine hundred and seven.
