

AN ACT to authorise a Loan of One thousand 1910. eight hundred Pounds to the Municipal Council of the Municipality of New Norfolk in accordance with the provisions of "The Local Public Works Loans Act, 1890," for the purpose of Improving the Water-supply of the Town of New Norfolk.

W HEREAS it is expedient that the Municipal Council of the PREAMBLE. Municipality of New Norfolk should be empowered to obtain a purer supply of water for the town of New Norfolk at a cost not exceeding in the whole the sum of Three thousand six hundred Pounds:

New Norfolk Loan.

And whereas, in consideration of the benefit to accrue therefrom to the New Norfolk Hospital for the Insane, Parliament has provided the sum of One thousand eight hundred Pounds by way of grantin-aid to the Warden, Councillors, and electors of the said Municipality towards the said cost:

And whereas it is desirable that the said Council, on behalf of the Corporation of the Municipality, should be authorised to borrow the balance of the said cost, namely, the sum of One thousand eight hundred Pounds, in the manner hereinafter appearing

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as "The Municipality of New Norfolk Loan Act, 1910."

Interpretation.

2 In this Act—

"Council" means the Muncipal Council of the Municipality of New Norfolk:

"Loans Act" means "The Local Public Works Loans Act, 1890," and the amendments thereof.

Power to borrow.

3 It shall be lawful for the Council, on behalf of the Corporation of the Municipality, to borrow any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of One thousand eight hundred Pounds for the purpose (in conjunction with the said amount granted by Parliament as aforesaid) of defraying the cost of obtaining a purer supply of water for the town of New Norfolk.

Power to lend.

4 It shall be lawful for the Governor to grant from time to time, in accordance with the provisions of "The Loans Act," any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of One thousand eight hundred Pounds, as a loan to the Warden, Councillors, and electors of the Municipality of New Norfolk for the purpose mentioned in the preceding section. Such sum or sums shall be defrayed out of moneys to be provided by Parliament for that purpose.

Provided that it shall not be necessary to lay before either House of Parliament plans and specifications of the proposed works, nor a report of the Engineer-in-Chief thereon, as provided in Section Two of the lastmentioned Act; but before any part of the said loan of One thousand eight hundred Pounds shall be advanced, plans and specifications of the proposed works, together with a report by the Engineer-in-Chief upon the probable cost thereof, the sufficiency of the plans and specifications, and upon such other matters connected with the works as the Engineer-in-Chief may deem it desirable to refer to in his said report, and that the work can, in his opinion, be completed for the amount proposed to be borrowed (together with the said sum of One thousand eight hundred Pounds provided by Parliament for that purpose), shall be submitted to and approved by the Governor.

New Nortolk Loan.

5 The Council shall not proceed in the matter of borrowing A.D. 1910. any sum of money until a poll has been taken of the water rate payers of the town of New Norfolk whose names appear on the water roll in force for the town of New Nortolk for the purpose of determining whether the Council shall borrow the money; and if at such poll Onethird or more of the aggregate number of votes recorded shall be against the borrowing, the Council shall not borrow.

Poll to be taken.

6 When the Council shall have decided to take a poll as afore- Notice to be said, it shall cause a notice that the poll will be taken to be published published in not less than Ten days before the day fixed for the taking of the poll "Gazette." not less than Twice in a daily newspaper circulating in the municipality, and Once in the "Gazette."

7 The notice shall state the hours during which, and the place at What is to be which, the poll will be taken, and the amount which it is proposed to stated in notice. borrow.

8 The voting-paper to be used at the taking of the poll shall be in Form of votingpaper. Schedule. the form in the schedule, or to the like effect.

9-(1.) The number of votes to which each water rate payer is Voting power. entitled shall, where a classification has been made, be determined by the class in which he is rated in the water roll in force for the town of New Norfolk, and shall be as follows:-

Class One	One vote
Class Two	Two votes
Class Three	Three votes
Class Four	Four votes
Excepted from classification	One vote

but no person shall have more than Four votes.

- (2.) Subject to the provisions of this Act, the proceedings at the taking of the poll shall, with any necessary alterations, be the same as those prescribed by law at an election of Councillors.
- 10 The expense of taking the poll shall be defrayed out of the Expenses out of Water Account. Water Account.

11 The Council are hereby empowered to lay the line of pipes Council along any public road, and to make such arrangements with the owners empowered to of land through which the line of pipes shall be laid as shall be deemed &c. advisable.
