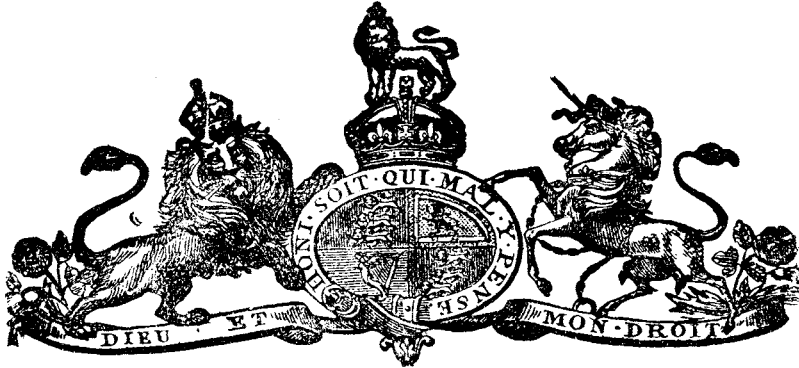

AN ACT to amend the Ministers of the Crown <sup>A.D.</sup> 1927.  
 Act, 1923. [16 September, 1927.]

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as “The Ministers of the Crown Act, 1927,” and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.

(2) The Ministers of the Crown Act, 1923, is herein called “the Principal Act.”

Repeal of Section 8 of the Principal Act, and substitution of new section.

Salaries of Ministers.

**2** Section Eight of the Principal Act is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor :—

“**8**—(1) From and after the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, there shall be paid and applied out of the Consolidated Revenue—

- i. As the yearly salaries of the persons for the time being holding the several ministerial offices mentioned in the schedule to this Act, the several sums set opposite the names of such offices respectively : and
- ii. To the person (if any) for the time being holding the office of Premier in conjunction with any of the ministerial offices mentioned in the said schedule, a salary at the yearly rate of Two hundred and fifty Pounds in addition to the salary attached to such lastmentioned office.

(2) If any person shall at any time hold more than one of the offices mentioned in the said schedule at the same time he shall be paid only in respect of the offices so held by him the salary allotted to one of such offices, and no more.”

Insertion of new Sections 9 and 10 after Section 8 of the Principal Act.

Allowance to Leader of the Opposition.

**3** The following new Sections Nine and Ten are hereby inserted after Section Eight of the Principal Act :—

“**9** From and after the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, there shall be paid and applied out of the Consolidated Revenue to the Leader for the time being of the Opposition an annual allowance of Two hundred and fifty Pounds, in addition to any other allowance to which he may be entitled as a Member of Parliament.”

How allowance payable.

“**10** The allowance payable under this Act to the Leader of the Opposition shall be payable by equal monthly payments upon the last day of each month commencing with the month of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven ; and the provisions of the Apportionment Act, 1871, shall apply to and in respect of such allowance as if the Crown were bound by that Act.”

**4** The schedule to the Principal Act is hereby repealed, and the following schedule substituted therefor :—
