AN ACT to amend "The North-Eastern 1915.

Harbour Trust Act, 1913," and for other purposes.

[21 January, 1916.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The North-Eastern Harbour Trust Short title and Act, 1915," and is hereby incorporated with, and shall be read as one with, "The North-Eastern Harbour Trust Act, 1913," in this Act No. 25. referred to as the Principal Act.

North-Eastern Harbour Trust Amendment.

Amendment of Section 2 of Principal Act.

- 2 Section Two of the Principal Act is hereby amended as follows:—

 1. By omitting from the definition "Advertised," the word
 "daily":
 - ii. By omitting the definition "Harbour," and substituting therefor the following definition thereof:—
 - "' Harbour' means the port or harbour of Anderson's Bay and the entrance thereto, commencing at a point on Andersou's Bay due north of the northeast angle of the Three hundred and eighty-five acres one rood and nineteen perches of land, purchased by E. B. Adams, thence north Eighty chains, thence east Three hundred and twenty chains, thence south to high water mark on Anderson's Bay aforesaid, and thence by high water mark south-westerly to the mouth of the Great Forester River, and thence by the high water mark on the eastern and northern side of such river to a point thereon north of the northeast corner of the One hundred and fifty acres of land purchased by James Shearer, thence south to the southern bank of the said Great Forester River, and thence by the high water mark on the southern and western side of the Great Forester River to Anderson's Bay aforesaid, and thence north-westerly by the high water mark on Anderson's Bay aforesaid, to the commencing point."
