

AN ACT to authorise the Loan of One thousand one hundred and fifty Pounds to the
Warden, Councillors, and Electors of the
Municipality of New Town, in accordance
with the provisions of "The Local Public
Works Loans Act, 1890."

[24 December, 1913.]

W HEREAS the Municipal Council of New Town has passed a PREAMBLE. special resolution authorising the said Council to borrow the sum of One thousand one hundred and fifty Pounds, for the works set forth in the schedule to this Act:

And whereas the said special resolution was duly confirmed after having been advertised and posted throughout the Municipality of New Town as prescribed in "The Local Government Act, 1906":

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

New Town Municipality Loan.

1 This Act may be cited as "The New Town Municipality Loan Act, 1913."

Short title.
interpretation

2 In this Act—

"The Corporation" means the Warden, councillors, and electors of the Municipality of New Town:

"The Council" means the Council of the said Municipality.

Power to borrow. 54 Vict. No. 30.

3 It shall be lawful for the Council, on behalf of the Corporation, to borrow under the provisions of "The Local Public Works Loans Act, 1890," upon the security of its revenues, any sum or sums of money, not exceeding in the whole One thousand one hundred and fifty Pounds, for the purpose of defraying the cost and expenses of or connected with the execution of the works mentioned in the Schedule to this Act.

Certain expenditure may be debited to loan account.

4 Any sums of moneys expended by the Council on the aforesaid works subsequently to the Twenty-seventh day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirteen, but prior to obtaining a loan under the provisions of this Act, may be debited to the account of such loan when it is obtained.

Governor may grant loans to Council. 54 Vict. No. 30.

5 It shall be lawful for the Governor to grant, in accordance with the provisions of "The Local Public Works Loans Act, 1890," any sum or sums of money, not exceeding in the whole One thousand one hundred and fifty Pounds, as a loan to the Corporation upon the security of all its revenues, for the purpose of defraying the cost and expenses mentioned in Section Three of this Act, and any such sum shall be defrayed out of moneys to be provided by Parliament for that purpose: Provided that it shall not be necessary to lay before either House of Parliament plans and specifications of any of such proposed works, nor a report of the Engineer-in-Chief thereon as provided in Section Two of the said Act: Provided further that no part of the said loan shall be advanced to the Council until the Engineer-in-Chief shall have certified in writing to the State Treasurer that he is satisfied with the manner in which the Council proposes to spend the money, and that the work proposed to be effected with such money can in his opinion be completed for the amount proposed to be borrowed therefor.
