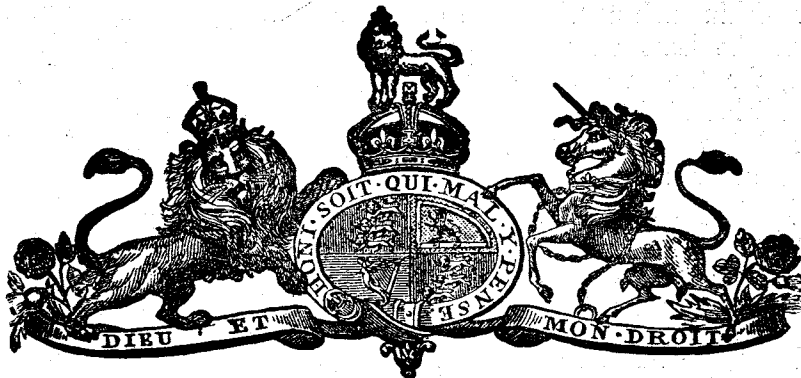

- 2. Repeal and re-enactment of Section 13 of "The Prison Act, 1868." Appointment of visiting justices.

AN ACT to amend "The Prison Act, 1868." A.D. 1921.  
—  
[21 September, 1921.]

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

**1** This Act may be cited as "The Prison Act, 1921." Short title.

**2** Section Thirteen of "The Prison Act, 1868," is hereby repealed, Repeal and re-enactment of Section 13 of "The Prison Act, 1868."  
and the following sections substituted therefor :—  
**"13—**(1) The Justices of the Peace, in each district assembled in General or Quarter Sessions which shall be first holden in the month of January in each year, shall appoint Two justices to be visiting justices for the ensuing year for every gaol under the control of the 32 Vict No. 11. Appointment of visiting justices.

Sheriff within such district, each of whom shall personally visit such gaols at the least once in every month, or oftener as occasion shall require, for the purpose of examining into the treatment, behaviour, and condition of the persons confined therein, together with the state and condition of the gaol; and such justices shall hold office until their successors are appointed.

“(2) The justices appointed in the month of April last, at the General or Quarter Sessions of the Peace for any district, to be visiting justices for the then ensuing year for any gaol or gaols within such district, shall hold office only until the time of the General or Quarter Sessions of the Peace for such district to be first holden in January next, or until their successors are appointed, whichever event shall first happen.”
