

AN ACT to amend The Police Act, 1865. [11 October, 1867.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend The Police Act, 1865: Be it PREAMBLE. therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and 29 Vict. No. 10. with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

1 The provisions contained in Section 179 of The Police Act, 1865, Provisions of shall extend and apply to every person who commits any offence therein named in or upon any public or common highway or road or other public way or place not being a Street in any Town, as well as to every extended. person who commits any such offence in any Street in any Town.

2 So much of the said Act as relates to Dogs shall be deemed to Application of apply to Tasman's Peninsula; and all sums and fees payable under the Act to Tasman's said Act in respect of Dogs shall be paid to such person, and the list of Peninsula. persons who have registered Dogs shall be kept at such place, as the Governor appoints.

3 All sums received for Stage Coach and Drivers' Licences under the said Act in each Municipality shall form part of the Municipal Fund, anything in Section Sixty of the said Act to the contrary notwith- Coach and Drivers' Licences.

4 This Act and The Police Act, 1865, save as altered or amended by Acts to be read this Act, shall be read and construed together as one and the same Act. together.

5 This Act may be cited as "The Police Act Amendment, 1867."
