AN ACT to authorise the raising of Money for
the Construction of certain Public Works.

[11 October, 1867.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to raise, by Loans secured on the General Revenue, Funds for the construction of certain Public Works : Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

PREAMBLE.

1 It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to cause to be raised by the issue and sale of Debentures secured on the General Revenue, in like manner as is prescribed in the Act 20th *Victoria*, No. 9, such sum or sums of money, not exceeding in the whole £10,000, as may be required for the purpose of defraying the cost of constructing and completing the Public Works authorised to be constructed and completed by “The Public Buildings Act, 1867;” and such Debentures shall be redeemable as follows :—

2 All the provisions contained in the said Act of the 20th *Victoria*, No. 9, shall apply and extend to the Debentures to be issued in pursuance of this Act.

3 This Act may be cited as “The Public Buildings Loans Act, 1867.”
