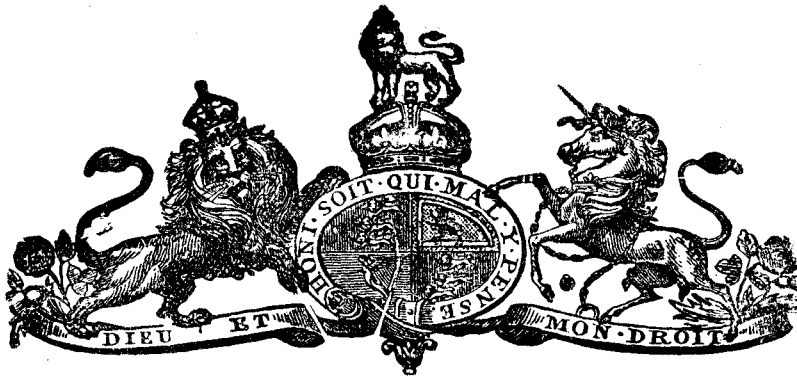

ANALYSIS.

1. Short title.
2. Authority to Minister to pay certain moneys.

AN ACT to amend the Potato Diseases Act, A.D.
1927.
1909. [22 December, 1927.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as “The Potato Diseases Act, 1927.”

Short title.

2—(1) It shall be lawful for the Minister to pay and apply out of the moneys standing to the credit of the Potato Diseases Fund Account a sum not exceeding Two thousand three hundred and eight Pounds Thirteen Shillings and Ten Pence to the Potato Marketing Board elected by the persons comprising the organisation known as the Agricultural Bureau.

Potato Diseases Amendment.

(2) At the beginning of each financial year hereafter it shall be lawful for the Minister to pay to the said Board out of the moneys from time to time standing to the credit of the said fund an amount calculated at a rate of One Halfpenny for every bag or three-bushel case in respect of which an inspection fee has been received by the Department of Agriculture in the preceding financial year.

(3) The Treasurer, on the authority of the Minister, may appropriate and issue such sum and such amounts as aforesaid out of the said fund.

(4) Such Board as aforesaid shall apply all moneys received under the authority of this Act for the purpose of dealing with the problem of marketing potatoes produced in this State and in furtherance of the objects for which such Board was elected as aforesaid.
