

ANACT to amend "The Public Debts A.D. 1892. Sinking Fund Act, 1881." [21 December, 1892.]

W HEREAS under the provisions of certain Acts of the Parliament PREAMBLE. of Tasmania the persons named in the Schedule (1.) hereto are entitled, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, to receive out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund annually, as pensions during their respective lives, the sums set opposite to their respective names in the said Schedule (1.):

And whereas the Governing Authority of the Church of England in Tasmania is entitled under the provisions of certain other Acts of the said Parliament to receive, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, certain sums of money out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to be paid to the persons named in the First Part of the Schedule (2.) hereto during their lives, or so long only as they shall respectively continue to act as Ministers of the "Church of *England* in *Tasmania*:"

And whereas under the provisions of "The State Aid Commutation 32 Vict. No. 30. Act" the Governing Authorities of the several Churches mentioned in the Second Part of the said Schedule (2.) are entitled, subject to the provisions of the last-mentioned Act, to receive annually out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund certain sums of money during the lives of the persons named in the First Part of the said Schedule (2.), or so long only as they shall respectively continue to act as Ministers of the "Church of England in Tasmania:"

And whereas the Governor in Council, upon being satisfied that any of the persons named in the First Part of the said Schedule (2.) is from

age or infirmity incapable of performing his duty, may grant such person a pension not exceeding Two hundred Pounds per annum during his life; such pension to be in lieu of the sums of money set opposite their respective names in the said First Part of the said Schedule (2.):

And whereas it is desirable to make provision for the payment of such pensions and annual sums of money hereinbefore mentioned by the Commissioners of The Public Debts Sinking Fund out of moneys from time to time forming part of the Public Debts Sinking Fund:

And whereas in consideration of such payment being made by the said Commissioners, it is desirable that the Treasurer of the Colony should be authorised to pay annually for a term of Thirty years out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of Five thousand four hundred and sixty-four Pounds to the said Commissioners, in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and

House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as "The Public Debts Sinking Fund Act, 1892."

Date of Act.

2 This Act shall come into operation and take effect on and after the First day of *January*, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

Interpretation. 45 Vict. No. 15.

- 3 In this Act, unless the context otherwise determines—
 - "The said Act" means "The Public Debts Sinking Fund Act, 1881:"
 - "The Commissioners" mean "The Commissioners of the Public Debts Sinking Fund" appointed under the provisions of the said Act:
 - said Act:
 "Fund" means "The Public Debts Sinking Fund" formed
 - under the said Act:
 "Governing Authority" means the Governing Authority as
 defined in Section One of The State Aid Distribution Act:
 - "Treasurer" means the Treasurer for the time being of Tasmania.

Commissioners to pay yearly sum to Treasurer.

4 The Commissioners shall, out of any moneys from time to time forming part of the Fund, pay to the Treasurer in every year such sum or sums of money as may be sufficient to provide for the payment by the said Treasurer to the persons mentioned in the Schedule (1.) hereto and to the Governing Authorities mentioned in the Schedule (2.) hereto of the respective sums to which they are entitled by any Act of the Parliament of Tasmania, and also to provide for the payment by the said Treasurer of any pensions that may be hereafter granted to the persons named in the First Part of the said Schedule (2.) Such sum or sums of money shall be paid by the Commissioners to the Treasurer in such proportions and at such times in each year as the Treasurer may appoint.

Treasurer to pay moneys mentioned in Schedules. 24 Vict. No. 15. **5**—(1.) The Treasurer shall, out of any moneys from time to time received by him from the Commissioners under the provisions of this Act, pay annually, subject to the provisions of *The Superannuation Act*, the sums set opposite to the names of the several persons

mentioned in Schedule (1.) hereto, by way of pension to such persons A.D. 1892. respectively for the term of their respective natural lives, in such proportions and at such times in each year as the Treasurer may

appoint.

(2.) The Treasurer shall, out of any moneys from time to time received by him from the Commissioners under the provisions of this Act, pay annually to the Governing Authorities of the Churches mentioned in the said Schedule (2.) such sum or sums of money as they may be entitled to receive from year to year from the Consolidated Revenue Fund under the provisions of any Act of the Parliament of Tasmania in force at the time of the passing of this Act, in such proportions and at such times in each year as the Treasurer may appoint.

(3.) In the event of the Governor in Council at any time granting a pension to any of the persons named in the First Part of the said Schedule (2.) under the provisions of "The State Aid Commutation 32 Vict. No. 30. Act," the Treasurer shall thereupon pay annually to any such person the sum so granted by way of pension during the life of such person.

- (4.) Any payment made by the Treasurer under this Act to the persons or Governing Authorities mentioned in the said Schedules shall be in lieu of the amounts to which they shall be respectively entitled to receive from the Consolidated Revenue Fund; and the receipts of the said persons and Governing Authorities of such payments shall be a full and sufficient discharge of the moneys which they are now respectively entitled to receive from the Consolidated Revenue Fund.
- 6 All sums of money received from time to time by the Treasurer Treasurer to from the Commissioners under the provisions of this Act shall be carry money carried by the Treasurer to a separate Account, and shall from time to received from the Commissioners time be paid by him upon the Warrant of the Governor to the several to separate persons and Governing Authorities mentioned in the said Schedules as account. hereinbefore provided; and the receipt or receipts of the said several persons and Governing Authorities for such moneys shall be a sufficient and full discharge to the Treasurer for the payment of the same.

7-(1.) Out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Tasmania there Appropriation of shall and may be paid and payable to the Commissioners the yearly Five thousand sum of Five thousand four hundred and sixty-four Pounds for a period sixty-four of Thirty years from the First day of January, One thousand Eight Pounds for hundred and ninety-three; and such sums shall be paid upon such Thirty years. days and in such proportions as the Governor, by any Warrant under his hand, orders and directs.

- (2.) All such sums when received by the Commissioners shall be by them paid into the Fund, and shall form part of the said Fund, and shall be moneys at the disposal of the Commissioners for the purposes of this Act or the said Act.
- 8 The Commissioners may invest all or any of the moneys received Commissioners by them from the Treasurer under the provisions of this Act, and all may invest or any of the money vested in or received by them under the said Act, and the interest or other profits accruing on any moneys or any Debentures or other securities transferred or delivered to or vested in them under or by virtue of this Act, or of the said Act, in such securities as the Governor in Council shall, from time to time prescribe as securities in which investments may be made by the Commissioners.

Treasurer may recoup expenses of sale of Debentures, &c. from premiums. **9** Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in Section Eight of the said Act, the Treasurer shall be entitled to deduct from any sum or sums of money received by him as premiums upon the sale of any Debentures or Treasury Bills all expenses and charges incurred by him in the issue and sale of any such Debentures or Treasury Bills, and the balance, after such deductions as aforesaid, shall be paid by him to the Commissioners.

Amendment of Sect. 14 of 45 Vict. No. 15. 10 In Section Fourteen of the said Act, after the word "after" in the First line of the said Section the words following are hereby inserted—"sufficient provision has been made to their satisfaction for," and the said Section shall be read and construed as if the said words had been inserted therein at the passing of the said Act.

Acts to be read together.

11 This Act and the said Act shall be read and construed together as one and the same Act.
