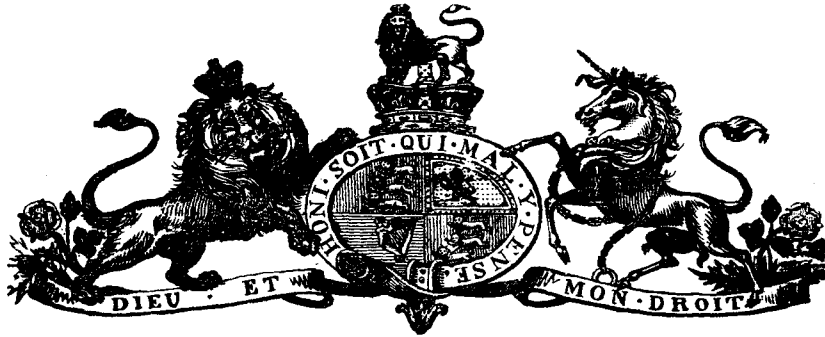

AN ACT to amend the Law relating to Powers of Attorney. [5 December, 1889.] A.D. 1889.

WHEREAS the Seventh Section of the Act, intituled "An Act to make valid acts done under Powers of Attorney in certain Cases," was repealed by "The Conveyancing and Law of Property Act, 1884":

And whereas it is expedient to revive the said Section of the Act firstly hereinbefore mentioned:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Powers of Attorney Act, 1889." Short title.

2 In this Act the expression "the said Act" means the Act *Victoria*, No. 3, intituled "An Act to make valid acts done under Powers of Attorney in certain Cases." Interpretation.

3 The Seventh Section of the said Act is hereby revived, and the said Act shall be hereafter read and construed as if the said Section had never been repealed. Sect. 7 of 24 Vict. No. 3 revived.

4 Part III. of the First Schedule to "The Conveyancing and Law of Property Act, 1884," is hereby expunged therefrom. Repeal of part of 47 Vict. No. 19.
