AN ACT to amend "The Post Office Act, 1881." A.D. 1885. [5 December, 1885.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in "The Post Postage on Office Act, 1881," the postage on all packets containing printed or plain packets of books, books, magazines, reviews, pamphlets, and music, (whether British, &c. Colonial, or Foreign), received at any Post Office for delivery within this Colony, or for transmission to any of the Australian Colonies or New Zealand, shall be charged and payable on all such packets, by weight, in manner following:

For any weight not exceeding Four ounces..... One Penny. For each additional Four ounces or portion thereof One Penny.

- 2 "The Post Office Act, 1881," as amended by this Act, and this Acts to be read Act, shall be read and construed together as one Act.
- 3 This Act may be cited as "The Post Office Act Amendment Short title. Act, 1885."
