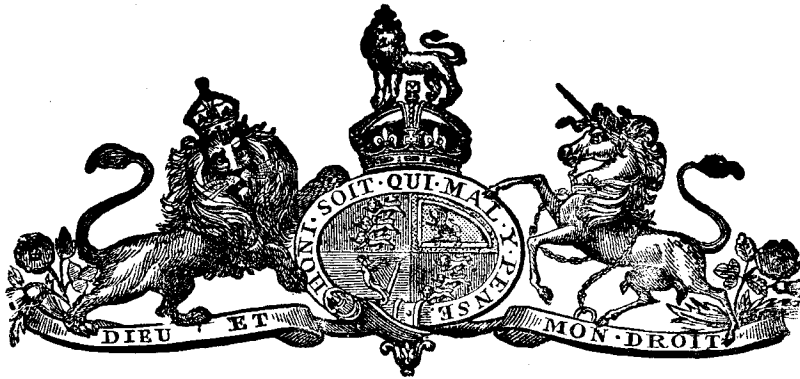

AN ACT to provide for Reimbursing Members of Parliament their Expenses in relation to their Attendance in Parliament, and for other purposes. [24 December, 1913.]

A.D. 1913.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Payment of Members Act, 1913," and shall commence on the First day of January, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen. Short title and commencement.

2 "The Payment of Members Act, 1900," and "The Payment of Members Act, 1910," are hereby repealed, except as to anything duly done thereunder before the commencement of this Act. Repeal of 63 Vict. No. 51 and 1 Geo. V. No. 53.

certain cases.**3** In this Act --

“Member” means a Member of the Legislative Council or House of Assembly of the Parliament of Tasmania, as the case may be.

**4**—(1) Except as hereinafter mentioned every Member shall out of the Consolidated Revenue be entitled to receive, by way of reimbursement for expenses incurred by him in the discharge of his parliamentary duties an allowance at the rate of Two hundred Pounds per annum.

In addition to such allowance as a Member, the Leader of the Opposition shall be also entitled to receive out of the Consolidated Revenue a further allowance at the rate of One hundred Pounds per annum.

(2) Except as hereinafter mentioned every Member at the commencement of this Act shall be entitled to payment of such allowance as from the First day of January, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, until he ceases to be a Member.

(3) Except as hereinafter mentioned every Member elected after the commencement of this Act shall be entitled to the payment of such allowance from the day of his election until he ceases to be a Member.

**5**—(1) The amount payable per annum to any Member under the provisions of this Act shall be payable by equal monthly payments upon the First day of each month.

(2) In the event of any Member being entitled to receive such allowance as aforesaid for any portion of a month, the amount payable for such month shall be proportionate to the number of days in such month during which he was so entitled.

**6** No Member whilst in receipt out of the Consolidated Revenue of an official salary, or any annual payment, shall be entitled to receive any such allowance as aforesaid except in so far as the amount of such allowance—or, in the case of the Leader of the Opposition, the amount of his allowances under this Act—may exceed the amount of such official salary or annual payment: Provided that this section shall not apply to any person holding the position of Premier without Ministerial office.
