

AN ACT to regulate the Salaries of Officers A.D. 1897. [24 December, 1897.] of Parliament.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 This Act may be cited as "The Parliamentary Officers' Salaries Short title. Act, 1897.'
 - 2 In this Act—

Interpretation.

- "The President" means the President of the Legislative
- "The Speaker" means the Speaker of the House of Assembly.
- 3 In case of any dissolution of the House of Assembly, the Speaker Speaker to hold of the said House at the time of such dissolution shall be and shall be office until next deemed to be the Speaker of the said House until the first meeting of meeting of Parlia-the new Parliament, unless he shall not be re-cleated a Mamban of the the new Parliament, unless he shall not be re-elected a Member of the said House; and the Chairman of Committees of such House at the time of such dissolution shall be and be deemed to be the Chairman of Committees until the first meeting of the new Parliament, unless he shall not be re-elected a Member of the said House.

Provided that nothing in this Section shall extend or be construed to enable any person hereby continued in the office of Speaker of the House of Assembly to preside at any meeting of the said House unless he shall have been re-elected as such Speaker.

President to hold office until next meeting of Parlia.

Committees of the President or the Chairman of Committees of the Legislative Council shall vacate his seat by periodical retirement, he shall be and shall be deemed to be the President or Chairman of Committees of such Council until the next meeting of Parliament, unless he shall not have been re-elected a Member of the said Council.

Commencement of Act.

5 This Act shall take effect as from the Twenty-eighth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.
