

AN ACT to provide for the Erection of School A.D. 1874. [18 September, 1874.] Houses.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 In this Act

Interpretation.

- "Board" means "The Board of Education."
- "School House" includes the teacher's dwelling attached thereto and all necessary buildings, in any case where the Board determines that a School House shall be erected with such dwelling and buildings.
- 2 It shall be lawful for the Board to cause School Houses, with Board of teacher's dwellings attached thereto and all necessary buildings, Education may to be erected and built in such localities as the Board may from Houses to be time to time determine, and the same shall when erected be vested erected. in the Board.

3 No School House shall be erected in any locality unless one-third One-third of cost of the estimated cost thereof is raised by subscription for that purpose to be raised by in the locality where such School House is intended to be built, nor subscription and unless the site proposed for the building is approved by and vested in Board. the Board.

Public Schools Erection.

Deeds vesting sites to contan clause of appropriation of same to Public School purposes. 4 In every deed by which any site for the erection of a School House is vested in the Board, there shall be inserted a clause declaring that the land and the buildings thereon to which it refers shall be for ever exclusively appropriated for the purposes of the Public School of the locality where it is situated, and that such school shall be for ever open to the children of all religious denominations without distinction, and subject to the control of the Board.

School House to be erected under proper supervision. 5 Before the erection of any School House is commenced the Board shall provide that the same be erected under proper supervision, and no payment shall be made on account of the erection of the same without satisfactory proof of the progress of the work; and before payment of the last instalment a proper certificate must be furnished to the Board that no debt remains on the building which cannot be liquidated by such instalment, and that it is in all respects fit and ready to be opened for school purposes.

Defrayment of cost.

6 Towards defraying the cost of the erection of such School Houses, such sum of money as Parliament from time to time provides for that purpose may be appropriated thereto.

Short title.

7 This Act may be cited as "The Public Schools Erection Act, 1874."
