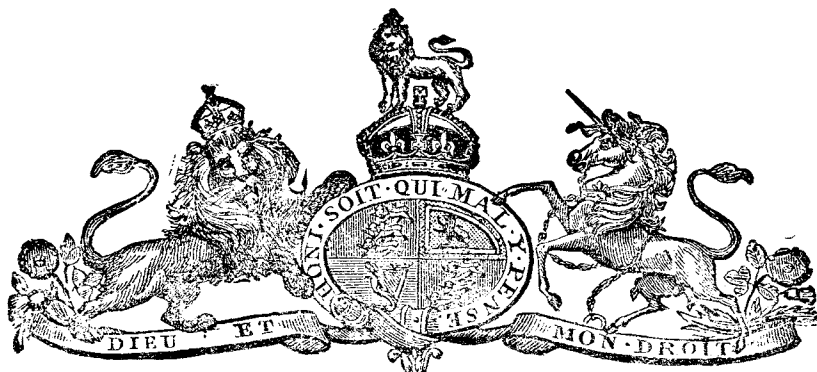

AN ACT to provide for the Execution of certain Public Works, and for other purposes. [21 December, 1926.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 This Act may be cited as “The Public Works Execution Act (No. 8), 1926.” Short title.

2 In this Act—

“Commissioners” means the Commissioners of the Public Debts Sinking Fund constituted under the Public Debts Sinking Fund Act, 1881 : Interpretation.
 “Schedule” means schedule to this Act. 45 Vict. No. 15.

Public Works Execution (No. 8).

Minister may cause to be constructed the works specified in schedule.

Money not required for work may be expended by Minister on other works.

Provisions of 44 Vict. No. 32 and 45 Vict. No. 31 to be applicable.

Land required may be acquired under 1 Geo. V. No. 11 or 58 Vict. No. 17 at option of Minister.

Treasurer authorised to borrow £4075.

Appropriation of £40 to redeem £4075.

Commissioners may invest moneys.

3 It shall be lawful for the Minister to cause to be constructed, improved, executed, or completed, the works specified in the schedule at a cost for each separate work not exceeding the amount set forth in the said schedule in respect thereof.

4 If the Minister at any time reports to the Governor that the whole or any portion of the money voted by this Act or any previous Act providing for the execution of public works is not required to be expended upon the work or item for which such money is voted, it shall be lawful for the Minister to expend such balance, provided it does not exceed Fifty Pounds, upon such other work or works previously authorised by Parliament, as he may think fit: Provided that such lastmentioned work is situated in the same city or municipality, as the case may be, as the work for which such money was originally voted.

5 The provisions of the Public Works Construction Act, 1880, and the Branch Roads Construction Act, 1881, shall extend and apply to the works mentioned in the schedule as fully in all respects as if the said provisions had been incorporated in this Act.

6 Notwithstanding anything contained in this or any other Act, any land required for the purpose of any public work authorised by this Act may, at the option of the Minister, be purchased, acquired, or taken under the Lands Resumption Act, 1910, or under the Land Vesting Act, 1894, and, in the event of such option being exercised in respect of either of those Acts, the provisions of such Act shall be deemed to be incorporated with this Act, in lieu of the provisions of the Public Works Construction Act, 1880, and the Branch Roads Construction Act, 1881.

7 It shall be lawful for the Treasurer to raise, borrow, and receive a total sum not exceeding Four thousand and seventy-five Pounds for the purposes of this Act.

8—(1) Out of the Consolidated Revenue there shall be paid to the Commissioners the yearly sum of Forty Pounds as a contribution towards a sinking fund for the purpose of redeeming the moneys borrowed and raised under this Act (hereinafter called "the principal").

(2) The said yearly sum shall be paid from the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and as the Governor, by any warrants under his hand, orders and directs, and such yearly payments shall be continued until the principal is fully redeemed.

(3) The Commissioners may invest and re-invest from time to time the moneys comprising such sinking fund as aforesaid, and the interest or other profit thereon, until the sinking fund is sufficient to redeem the principal, when the same shall be applied for that purpose.

(4) All such investments shall be in accordance with the conditions provided by the Public Debts Sinking Fund Act, 1881.
