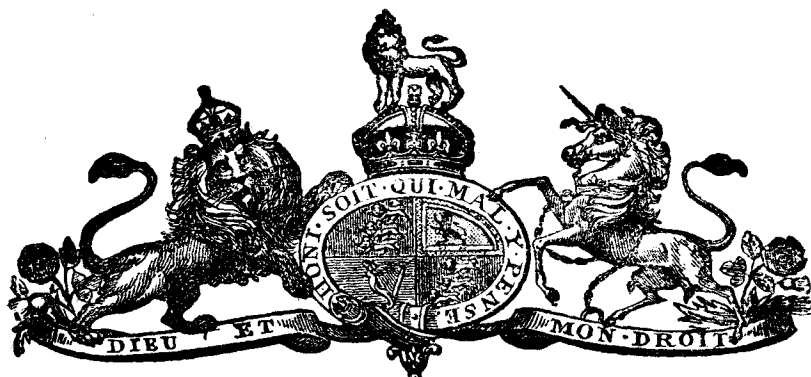

ANALYSIS.

1. Short title.

AN ACT to provide for the Execution of ^{A.D.} 1929.
 certain Public Works and to amend the
 Public Works Execution Act (No. 2), 1928.
 [25 July, 1929.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 This Act may be cited as “The Public Works (Restoration of Short title. Roads and Bridges) Execution Act, 1929.”

Public Works (Restoration of Roads and Bridges) Execution.

A.D. 1929.

Minister may cause to be constructed the works specified in the schedules.

Money not required for work may be expended by Minister on other works.

Provisions of 44 Vict. No. 32 and 45 Vict. No. 31 to be applied.

Land required may be acquired under 1 Geo. V. No. 11 or 58 Vict. No. 17 at option of Minister.

Treasurer authorised to borrow £85,000.

Amendment of 19 Geo. V. No. 14 Schedule (1).

2 It shall be lawful for the Minister to cause to be constructed, improved, executed, or completed the works specified in Schedules (1) and (2) to this Act at a cost for each separate work not exceeding the amount set forth in the said schedules in respect thereof.

3 If the Minister at any time reports to the Governor that the whole or any portion of the money voted by this Act, or any previous Act providing for the execution of public works, is not required to be expended upon the work or item for which such money is voted, it shall be lawful for the Minister to expend such balance, provided it does not exceed Fifty Pounds, upon such other work or works previously authorised by Parliament, as he may think fit: Provided that such lastmentioned work is situated in the same city or municipality, as the case may be, as the work for which such money was originally voted.

4 The provisions of the Public Works Construction Act, 1880, and the Branch Roads Construction Act, 1881, shall extend and apply to the works mentioned in the schedules to this Act as fully in all respects as if the said provisions had been incorporated in this Act.

5 Notwithstanding anything contained in this or any other Act, any land required for the purpose of any public work authorised by this Act may, at the option of the Minister, be purchased, acquired, or taken under the Lands Resumption Act, 1910, or under the Land Vesting Act, 1894, and, in the event of such option being exercised in respect of either of those Acts, the provisions of such Act shall be deemed to be incorporated with this Act, in lieu of the provisions of the Public Works Construction Act, 1880, and the Branch Roads Construction Act, 1881.

6 It shall be lawful for the Treasurer to raise, borrow, and receive a total sum not exceeding Eighty-five thousand Pounds for the purposes of this Act.

7 The Public Works Execution Act (No. 2), 1928, is hereby amended by inserting therein after the word "extension" in the item numbered 477 in Schedule (1) thereto the words "and shed."
