

Salary of Commissioner.

# AN ACT to amend "The Railway Management Act, 1910," and for other purposes.

[21 September, 1921.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Railway Management Act, Short title and 1921," and shall be incorporated and read as one with "The Reilway Management Act, 1891."

2 In this Act— Interpretation. "The Act of 1910" means "The Railway Management Act, 1 Geo. V. No. 69. 1910."

#### Railway Management Amendment.

Temporary reappointment of Commissioner. 3—(1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Act of 1910, the person who, immediately prior to the First day of April, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, held the office of Commissioner for Railways, shall be deemed to have been lawfully re-appointed to that office on the lastmentioned date for a term extending from such date to the Thirtieth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, at the salary of One thousand five hundred Pounds a year.

(2) The said salary is hereby charged on the Consolidated Revenue, and such revenue to the extent required for the payment of the salary

for the aforesaid term is hereby appropriated.

Repeal and reenactment of Section 12 of the Act of 1910. Salary of Commissioner. 4 Section Twelve of the Act of 1910 is hereby repealed, and the following section substituted therefor:—

"12 The Commissioner shall receive the salary of One thousand

five hundred Pounds a year.

The said salary is hereby charged on the Consolidated Revenue, and such revenue to the extent required for the payment of the salary is hereby permanently appropriated."
