

ANALYSIS.

- 1. Short title.
- 2. Certain persons whose lands have been torfeited may be reinstated as purchasers.
- 3. Certain persons may be permitted to complete purchase of land.
- 4. Vesting of certain land in trustees of Hutchins School.
- 5. Commissioner may sell certain land to Wm. Francis Cloak.
- 6. Commissioner may sell certain land to Samuel Hutton.
- 7. Power to exchange certain land with Frank Whistler Butler.
- 8. Power to exchange land at Wynyard with John Ashby White.
- 9. Power to exchange certain land at Hobart with Henry Cane.
- 10. Commissioner may sell certain land to the Church of England.

AN ACT to provide for the Reinstatement of 1912. certain Persons as Purchasers of certain Crown Lands, and for other purposes.

[17 December, 1912.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Reinstatement of Crown Lands Short title. Purchasers Act, 1912."

A.D. 1912

Certain persons whose lands have been forfeited may be reinstated as purchasers. Schedule (1).

2 The Commissioner of Crown Lands may, with the consent of the Governor, reinstate the persons named in Schedule (1) hereto as purchasers of the several lots or areas of land set opposite to their names, under the provisions of the Acts regulating the sale or disposition of Crown lands under which the purchases of such lots or areas were respectively made; and thereupon such persons shall be liable to pay all instalments upon such lands at the date of forfeiture, and all instalments thereafter due thereon, together with the amount of fines and charges for the cost of advertising, as provided in Section Ninetysix of "The Crown Lands Act, 1911," together with interest at the rate of Five Pounds per centum per annum from the date when such instalments became due.

Certain persons named in Schedule (2) to be permitted to complete their purchases. 3 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in "The Crown Lands Act, 1890," "The Crown Lands Act, 1903," "The Crown Lands Act, 1911," it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands to permit the persons named in Schedule (2) hereto to complete the purchase of the several areas of land set opposite to their names; and upon payment of the balance of purchase-money into the Treasury, together with a grant fee of Fifteen Shillings, the Governor is hereby authorised, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to convey and alienate the said lands to the said persons respectively, in fee simple, or for any less estate or interest.

Vesting of certain land in trustees of the Hutchins School.

4 Whereas the express condition upon which the land described in Schedule (3) to this Act was granted to the Mayor, Aldermen, and citizens of the city of Hobart has been broken, and such land is absolutely forfeited to the Crown:

And whereas the Government have decided to dispose of the said land to the trustees of the Hutchins School:

Now therefore it is hereby enacted as follows:—In consideration of the sum of One hundred and fifty Pounds purchase-money therefor paid to the State Treasurer, the piece of land described in Schedule (3) to this Act—now revested in the Crown—is hereby vested, by the mere operation of this section, in Frederick Taylor Whitington, Joseph Bertram Kite, and Edward Henry Butler, in fee simple, to hold the same upon the trusts and subject to the powers upon and subject to which the piece of land described in the schedule to "The Hutchins School Act, 1911," is now held, and as if the land hereby vested were part of the land comprised in the schedule to that Act; and the land hereby vested shall not be deemed to be subject to the provisions of "The Real Property Act."

Commissioner may sell certain land to Wm. Francis Cloak. Schedule (4).

5 It shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands to sell by private contract to William Francis Cloak the lot of Crown land described in Schedule (4) hereto, for the sum of Twenty-two Pounds, and upon payment of such sum of money, together with a grant fee of Fifteen Shillings, into the Treasury, the Governor is hereby authorised,

in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to convey and A.D. 1912. alienate the said land to the said William Francis Cloak in tee simple, or for any less estate or interest.

6 It shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands to sell Commissioner by private contract to Samuel Hutton the Crown land described in may sell certain Schedule (5) hereto for the sum of Ten Pounds; and upon payment land to Samuel Hutton. of such sum of money into the Treasury, together with a grant fee Schedule (5), of Fifteen Shillings, the Governor is hereby authorised, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to convey and alienate the said land to the said Samuel Hutton, in fee simple, or for any less estate or interest.

7 Upon Frank Whistler Butler executing a surrender to His Majesty Power to the King of all his right, title, and interest in and to the land exchange certain described in Schedule (6), it shall be lawful for the Governor, in the Largo with F. name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to convey and alienate W. Butler. the lands described in Schedule (7) to the said Frank Whistler Schedules (6) Butler, in fee simple, or for any less estate or interest in lieu of the and (7). said land and in full satisfaction of all claims and demands for compensation.

8 Upon John Ashby White surrendering to His Majesty the King all his right, title, and interest in and to the land described in Schedule (8), it shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of Wynyard with His Majesty the King, to convey and alienate the land described in John Ashby Schedule (9) to the said John Ashby White, in fee simple, or for any less estate or interest.

Power to exchange certain land in town of White. Schedules (8) and (9).

9 Upon Henry Cane surrendering to His Majesty the King all his Power to right, title, and interest in and to the land described in Schedule (10) hereto, and upon payment into the Treasury of the sum of One hundred and twenty-six Pounds five Shillings, together with a grant fee of Cane. Fifreen Shillings, it shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and Schedules (10) on behalf of His Majesty the King, to convey and alienate the land and (11). described in Schedule (11) hereto to the said Henry Cane, in fee simple, or for any less estate or interest.

exchange certain land in Hobart with Heary

10 It shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands to sell Commissioner by private contract to the Trustees of the Property of the Church of land to Church of England, in Tasmania, Lot 5, Section Q1, containing Thirty-five and England. three-quarter perches, in the Town of Rosebery, for the sum of Twenty Pounds, such sale to be subject to the provisions of "The Crown Lands Act, 1911.''

Upon payment of such sum of money, together with a grant fee of Fifteen Shillings and a survey fee of One Pound Eleven Shillings the Government is hereby authorised, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to convey and alienate the surface of the said land to the said trustees in fee simple, or for any less estate or interest.

Bounded on the south-west by 70½ links north-westerly along Barrack-street commencing at the angle of that street and Macquarie-street on the north-west by 48½ links north-easterly along land granted to William Kermode, Richard Dry, Fitzherbert Adams Marriott, Valentine Fleming, and Rowland Robert Davies on the north-east by 70 links south-easterly also along that grant and thence on the south-east by 49 links south-westerly along Macquarie-street aforesaid to the point of commencement.
