

#### ANALYSIS.

- 1. Short title.
- 2. Certain persons whose lands have been forfeited may be reinstated as purchasers.

- 5. Commissioner may sell certain land to A. A. Waugh.
- 6. Commissioner may sell certain land to the Bank of Australasia.
- 7. Commissioner may sell certain land to Thomas Strickland, Schedule (6).

AN ACT to provide for the Reinstatement of 1915.
certain Persons as Purchasers of certain
Crown Lands, and for other purposes.

[21 January, 1916.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Reinstatement of Crown Lands Short title. Purchasers Act, 1915."

Certain persons whose lands have been forfeited may be reinstated as purchasers. Schedule (1).

2 The Commissioner of Crown Lands may, with the consent of the Governor, reinstate the persons named in Schedule (1) hereto as purchasers of the several lots or areas of land set opposite to their names, under the provisions of the Acts regulating the sale or disposition of Crown lands under which the purchases of such lots or areas were respectively made; and thereupon such persons shall be liable to pay all instalments upon such lands at the date of forfeiture, and all instalments thereafter due thereon, together with the amount of fines and charges for the cost of advertising, as provided in Section Ninetysix of "The Crown Lands Act, 1911," together with interest at the rate of Five Pounds per centum per annum from the date when such instalments became due.

Certain persons named in Schedule (2) to be permitted to complete their purchases. 3 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any repealed or existing Act regulating the sale or disposition of lands of the Crown, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands to permit the persons named in Schedule (2) hereto to complete the purchase of the several areas of land set opposite to their names; and upon payment of the balance of purchase-money into the Treasury, together with a grant fee of Fifteen Shillings, the Governor is hereby authorised, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to convey and alienate the said lands to the said persons respectively, in fee simple, or for any less estate or interest.

Upon Municipal Council of New Town complying with certain conditions and surrendering a certain lease, Governor may convey to Warden, councillors, and electors of New Town land in Schedule (3), subject to conditions.

4 Upon the Municipal Council of the Municipality of New Town levelling to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Crown Lands certain 1 acre 0 roods 7½ perches of land leased from the Crown, fronting on Pillinger-street, in the Town of New Town, and known as the Jutland Quarry, and also constructing a concrete drain within the drainage reserve abutting thereon, to the satisfaction of the said Commissioner, and upon the lease of the said land being duly surrendered to His Majesty the King it shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to convey and alienate the land described in Schedule (3) to the Warden, councillors, and electors of the Municipality of New Town in fee simple or for any less estate or interest; but the conveyance of the said land shall contain a condition that the said Warden, councillors, and electors shall not sell or mortgage their interest therein.

Commissioner may sell certain land to Andrew Alexander Waugh. Schedule (4).

5 It shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands to sell under "The Crown Lands Act, 1911," by private contract to Andrew Alexander Waugh, the lot of Crown land described in Schedule (4) hereto, for the sum of Ten Pounds, and upon payment of such sum of money, together with a grant fee of Fifteen Shillings, into the Treasury, the Governor is hereby authorised, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to convey and alienate the said land to the said Andrew Alexander Waugh in fee simple, or for any less estate or interest.

6 It shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands to sell A.D. 1915. under "The Crown Lands Act, 1911," by private contract to the Bank of Australasia the Crown land described in Schedule (5) hereto for the sum of Fifteen Pounds; and upon payment of such sum of land to the Bank money into the Treasury, together with a grant fee of Fifteen Shillings, of Australasia. the Governor is hereby authorised in the name and on behalf of His Schedule (5). Majesty the King, to convey and alienate the said land to the said Bank of Australasia in fee simple, or for any less estate or interest.

7—(1) It shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands to Commissioner enter into a contract for the sale to and purchase by Thomas Strick- may sell certain land (hereinafter in this section referred to as "the purchaser," which Strickland. expression shall include his executors, administrators, and assigns, where Schedule (6). the context so requires or admits) of the piece of land described in Schedule (6) hereto, at the price, upon the terms, and subject to the conditions hereinafter in this section contained—

I. The price shall be One Pound Five Shillings per acre, payable Terms and by Eight equal annual instalments, the First of such pay-conditions. ments to be made before the expiration of Six calendar months from the contract of purchase being entered The purchaser shall pay interest from time to time as specified in the contract upon the amount of the purchase money for the time being remaining unpaid, at the rate of Five Pounds per centum per annum. The purchaser may at any time before the time appointed for completion of the said contract pay off the whole or any part of the balance of the purchase money then remaining unpaid under the said contract;

- II. The purchaser shall in each year during Eight consecutive years from the date of the said contract expend a sum of not less than One hundred and fifty Pounds in fencing, clearing, draining, cultivating, and otherwise improving the said piece of land. Provided that the purchaser having expended more than the said sum in any year shall be entitled to credit against his liability in any subsequent year for such extra expenditure:
- III. There shall be excluded from the said piece of land an area not exceeding One-half of an acre fronting on or near to the present road leading from Currie to Cape Wickham. The location and boundaries of such area shall be determined by the said Commissioner. If the said area forms part of land leased from the Crown to the purchaser, the purchaser shall surrender such area to the Crown, and the said area shall thenceforth be reserved for public purposes.

Within Six months from the location by the said Commissioner of such area, or within Six months from the date of the contract, whichever shall be the longer period, the

purchaser at his own expense shall, for the convenience of the public, erect on such area to the satisfaction of the said Commissioner, a water-trough suitable and sufficient for the watering of stock, and a windmill or other contrivance which will supply sufficient water to such trough, and shall thereafter, until he is entitled to the issue of a grant deed for the land purchased by him, maintain the said windmill or other contrivance, and keep the said trough in good repair and constantly supplied with sufficient water for the watering of such stock as may require the same, unless he shall be prevented by causes beyond his control, of which causes the said Commissioner shall be the sole judge.

The purchaser shall at all times have the full right of access to the said area to carry out the purposes aforesaid, or any of them. If the purchaser shall at any time neglect or fail to carry out the conditions imposed upon him by this paragraph, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner to do all things necessary to fulfil such conditions and to recover the cost of so doing from the purchaser in any court of competent jurisdiction. As soon as he is entitled to the issue of a grant deed for the land purchased, the purchaser shall transfer or deliver the said windmill or other contrivance, and the said water-trough and all pipes used in connection therewith in good working order and condition to the Municipal Council of King Island, and shall thereafter permit the said Council without charge to draw from the lands of the purchaser such quantity of water as may be necessary to keep the said trough properly supplied with water, and shall allow the said Council the necessary right of ingress and egress for such purpose; and upon such transfer or delivery to the said ('ouncil, the obligations imposed upon the purchaser by this paragraph in relation to the said water-trough, windmill or other contrivance and water supply, shall cease, and shall thenceforth by virtue of this section devolve upon the said Council, and the Governor may by Proclamation vest the said area in the Warden, councillors and electors of the Municipality of King Island, subject to the obligations imposed upon the said Council as hereinbefore mentioned:

- IV. The contract may also contain such other provisions as the said Commissioner may think proper.
- (2) When the whole of the purchase money for the said piece of land, together with the interest thereon, has been fully paid, and the conditions imposed hereby have been fulfilled and the usual survey fee and a grant fee of Fifteen Shillings have been paid, the Governor is hereby authorised, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to convey and alienate the said land to the purchaser in fee simple, or for any less estate or interest.

8 Upon Cecil Allport surrendering to His Majesty the King all his A.D., 1915. right, title, and interest in and to the land described in Schedule (7), Power to being portion of the land purchased by him from the Crown under a substitute in contract of purchase under the credit system, the Commissioner of Crown contract of sale to Lands shall by endorsement upon the said contract substitute therein Cecil Allport the land described in Schedule (8) for the land so surrendered, and land in Schedule the rand described in Schedule (8) for land in thereupon the land so substituted shall be taken to be comprised in the Schedule (7). said contract in lieu of the land surrendered and to be of the same value, but the contract shall not be otherwise disturbed.

9 In consideration of Charles Von Bibra surrendering to His Power to Majesty the King all his right, title, and interest in certain land described in Schedule (9), and complying with such terms and Tunbridge with conditions as the Commissioner of Crown Lands may see fit to impose Charles Von with regard to survey, fencing, and planting Marram grass and the Bibra. payment of the cost thereof, it shall be lawful for the Governor, in the Schedules (9), name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to convey and alienate (10), and (11). the land described in Schedules (10) and (11) to the said Charles Von Bibra, in fee simple, or for any less estate or interest, in lieu of the said land and in full satisfaction of all claims and demands for any compensation.
