AN ACT to provide for the Reinstatement of 1927. certain Persons as Purchasers of certain Crown Lands, and for other purposes.

[19 *December*, 1927.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as "The Reinstatement of Crown Short title. Lands Purchasers Act, 1927."
- (2) The Crown Lands Act, 1911, is hereby incorporated with this Incorporation of Act.

2 In this Act "schedule" means schedule to this Act.

Interpretation. Certain persons whose lands have been forfeited as purchasers. Schedule (1).

3 The Commissioner of Crown Lands may, with the consent of the Governor, reinstate the persons named in Schedule (1) as purchasers of the several lots or areas of land set opposite to their may be reinstated respective names, under the provisions of the Acts regulating the sale or disposition of Crown lands under which the purchasers of such lots or areas were respectively made; and thereupon such persons shall be liable to pay all instalments due upon such lands at the date of forfeiture, and all instalments thereafter due thereon, together with the amount of fines and charges for the cost of advertising, as provided in 2 Geo. V. No. 64. Section Ninety-six of the Crown Lands Act, 1911, together with

interest at the rate of Five Pounds per centum per annum from the

date when such instalments became due.

Certain persons named in Schedule (2) to be permitted to complete their purchases.

4 Nothwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any repealed or existing Act regulating the sale or disposition of lands of the Crown, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands to permit the persons named in Schedule 2) to complete the purchase of the several areas of land set opposite to their respective names; and upon payment of the balance of purchase-money, in each instance, into the Treasury, together with a grant fee of One Pound, the Governor is hereby authorised, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to convey and alienate the said lands to the said persons respectively, in fee simple.

Power to exchange certain land with George MusgravParker.

5 In consideration of George Musgrave Parker having surrendered to His Majesty the King all his right, title, and interest in and to the land described in Schedule (3), it shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of His said Majesty, to convey and alienate the Schedules (3) and land described in Schedule (4) to the said George Musyrave Parker or his assigns, in fee simple.

Commissioner may sell certain land to Electrolytic Zinc Company of Australasia Limited.

6—(1) It shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands to sell by private contract to the Electrolytic Zinc Company of Australasia Limited the Crown land described in Schedule (5) for the sum of Three thousand Pounds, and upon payment of such sum of money the Governor is hereby authorised, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to convey and alienate the said land to the said Electrolytic Zinc Company of Australasia Limited, in fee simple, subject to such easements as are referred to in the said schedule.

(2) All moneys produced by the sale of the said land shall be credited to the loan account or accounts in the Treasury from which the moneys were originally expended for the acquisition of such land.

Commissioner may sell certain land and pay purchase-money to Municipal Council of Portland.

7—(1) It shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands to sell by private contract or by auction the land comprising eighteen acres two roods five perches, situate in the Town of St. Helens and described in Schedule (6) to such person and for such sum as he shall think fit, and, upon payment of such sum of money into the Treasury,

the Governor is hereby authorised, in the name and on behalf of His A.D. 1927. Majesty the King, to convey and alienate the said land to the pur-

chaser thereof, in fee simple.

(2) The Treasurer is hereby authorised to pay over the purchasemoney of the aforesaid land to the Council of the Municipality of Portland, towards completion of the purchase of an area of land in the vicinity of the Town of St. Helens, such area to be approved by the Commissioner of Crown Lands, and to be conveyed to the Warden, councillors, and electors of the Municipality of Portland for recreation purposes.

8—(1) It shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands to Commissioner sell by private contract to George James Weily the Crown land may sell certain described in Schedule (7) for the sum of Four hundred and fifty James Weily. Pounds; and, upon payment of such sum of money into the Treasury, the Governor is hereby authorised, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, to convey and alienate the said land to the said George James Weily, in fee simple.

(2) All moneys produced by the sale of the said land shall be 17 Geo. V. No. 2. credited to the loan account in the Treasury of the moneys provided under the Public Works Execution Act (No. 3), 1926, and in respect of Item 2 of Schedule (2) to that Act.

9 Section Five of the Crown Lands Purchasers' Reinstatement Repeal of Section Act, 1926, is hereby repealed as from the commencement of that Act
