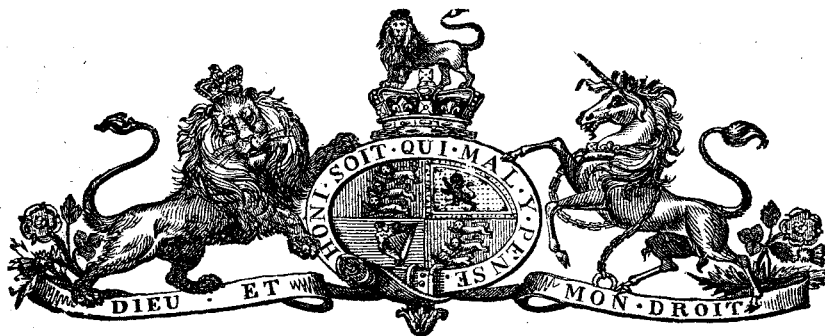

AN ACT to amend *The Rural Police Rate Act.*
[20 February, 1867.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to enable the Governor in Council to raise and levy a Rural Police Rate, not exceeding the sum of One Shilling in the Pound, on the Annual Value of Property in such parts of the Colony as are not Municipalities: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

PREAMBLE.

1 For the year 1867 the Governor in Council may make and levy a Rate, not exceeding the sum of Ninepence in the Pound, in lieu of the Rate of Sixpence in the Pound in the First Section of *The Rural Police Rate Act* mentioned, in such Municipal Districts as from time to time are not Municipalities within the meaning of *The Rural Municipalities Act*, 1865; and all the provisions of *The Rural Police Rate Act* shall apply to such increased Rate.

Governor in Council may make and levy a Rural Police Rate for the year 1867 not exceeding Ninepence in the Pound.

2 This Act and *The Rural Police Rate Act*, except in so far as the same is altered by this Act, shall be read and construed together as one and the same Act.

Acts to be read together.

3 In referring to this Act it shall be sufficient to use the expression *The Rural Police Rate Act, No. 2.*
