

AN ACT to authorise a Contract Survey for A.D. 1900. a Railway from Glenora to Zeehan. [6 December, 1900.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

1 This Act may be cited as "The Railway Survey Act, 1900."

Short title.

2 In the event of the forfeiture of the rights, privileges, and concessions conferred by "The Great Western Railway and Electric Ore-Reduction Company Act" upon the Promoters referred to in the said Act, it shall be lawful for the Minister of Lands and Works to cause to be made a contract survey for a Line of Railway from Glenora to Zeehan, at a total cost not exceeding the sum of Fifteen thousand Pounds, which shall be defrayed out of funds to be provided by Parliament for the purpose.

Minister to cause Survey and Estimate of a Line of Railway.

3 It shall be lawful for any person appointed or employed by the Entry on land to Minister for the purposes of this Act to enter upon any lands, without survey. notice, to survey and take the levels for the same, and to ascertain and stake or set out such parts thereof as may be necessary and proper for the laying out any such Line of Railway. 4d.

Railway Survey

A.D. 1900. Offences.

4 If any person does any of the following things, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty Pounds:—

Wilfully impedes, hinders, or interrupts any person appointed or employed under this Act in the performance of any act authorised hereby:

Wilfully interferes with, moves, injures, or damages any poles, stakes, marks, or instruments used by such person or his assistants for the purpose of surveying or marking out any such Line of Railway or otherwise in connection therewith.

Procedure in respect of offences.

5 All offences against this Act shall be heard and determined, and all penalties shall be recovered, in the mode prescribed by *The Magistrates Summary Procedure Act*.
