**\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\***\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\* AN ACT to authorise Surveys for certain 1921 Railways, and for other purposes. [2 December, 1921.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Railway Survey Act, 1921."

Short title.

2 It shall be lawful for the Minister for Works to cause to be made Minister to cause or completed surveys for the lines of railway mentioned in the surveys and schedule to this Act; and each such survey shall include a special estimates of lines detailed report and estimate upon the cost of building the line on a gauge of Three feet Six inches.

### Railway Survey.

**A**.D. 1921.

Minister may acquire land for purposes of railway described in Item 3 in schedule.

Expenditure on Items 1 and 2 of schedule.

Expenditure on Item 3 of schedule.

3 It shall be lawful for the Minister for the purposes of the construction of the line of railway described in Item 4 of the said schedule to purchase, acquire, and take any land which he may consider will hereafter be necessary for the purposes aforesaid.

4—(1) The amounts to be expended on or for the completion of the surveys of the lines of railway described in Items 1, 2, and 3 of the said schedule shall not exceed the respective amounts for the same set out in the said schedule.

(2) The amount to be expended on the survey of the line of railway described in Item 4 of the said schedule and on the purchase, acquisition, or taking of the land referred to in Section Three shall not exceed in the whole the amount for the same set out in the said schedule.

Moneys to be provided by Parliament.

5 The whole of the moneys to be expended under or for the purposes of this Act shall be defrayed out of moneys to be provided by Parliament for that purpose.

Entry on land to survey.

6 It shall be lawful for any person appointed or employed by the said Minister for any of the purposes of this Act to enter upon any lands without notice, and to survey and take levels, and to ascertain the parts of the said lands which are necessary and proper for laying out any of the said lines of railway, and to stake or set out such parts or any of them.

Offences.

7 No person shall—

1. Wilfully impede, hinder, or interrupt any person appointed or employed under this Act in the performance of any act authorised hereby:

11. Wilfully interfere with, move, injure, or damage any poles, stakes, marks, or instruments used by any such person or his assistants for the purpose of surveying or marking out any of the said lines of railway, or otherwise in connection therewith.

Penalty: Twenty Pounds.

Procedure.

8 All complaints for offences against this Act shall be heard and 10 Geo, V. No. 55 determined, and all penalties shall be recovered, in a summary way by and before a police magistrate or any Two or more justices, in the mode prescribed by "The Justices' Procedure Act, 1919."
