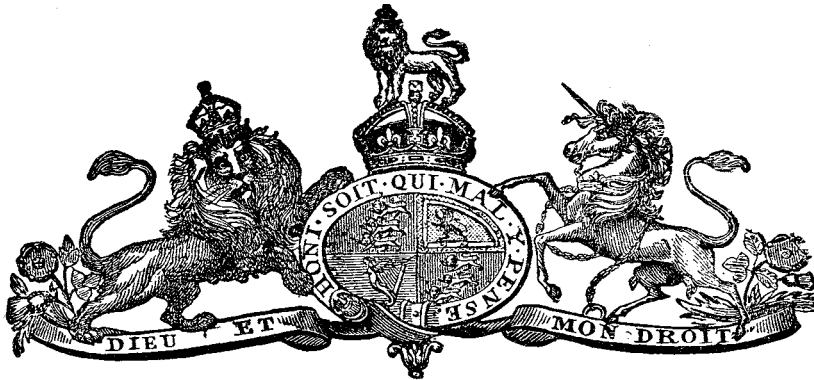

AN ACT to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue a Sum for the Service of the Year ending the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four. A.D. 1923.
 [29 June, 1923.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as “The Supply Act (No. 1), 1923-24.” Short title.

Supply (No. 1).

A.D. 1923.

Issue and application of £374,692.

2 There shall and may be issued and applied towards making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, the sum of Three hundred and seventy-four thousand six hundred and ninety-two Pounds out of the Consolidated Revenue, for the purposes and services expressed in the schedule to this Act; and the Treasurer of Tasmania is hereby authorised and empowered to issue and apply the moneys authorised to be issued and applied.

Sum available for the purposes set forth in schedule.

3 The said sum shall be available to satisfy the warrants under the hand of the Governor in respect of any purposes and services set forth in the said schedule.

Credit to be given to the Treasurer in accounts.

4 The said Treasurer shall be allowed credit in his accounts for any sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any such warrant as aforesaid; and the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same are so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sums as are therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.
