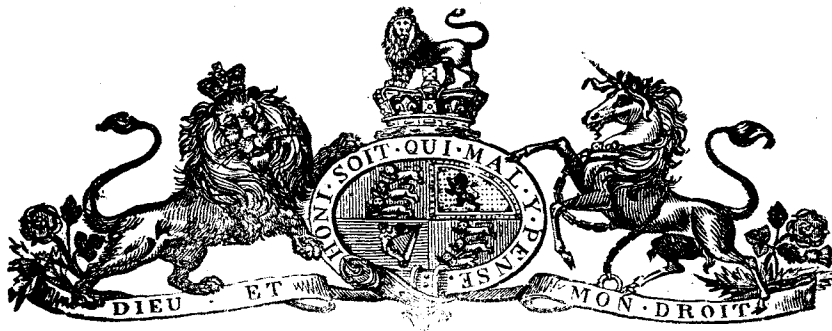

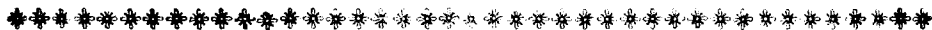

AN ACT to further amend "The Scab Act, 1875." [29 October, 1883.] A.D. 1883.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 So much of the Forty-fourth Section of "The Scab Act, 1875," as provides for the punishment of persons driving Inland any imported Sheep until the same have been dipped in some effective Scab-destroying preparation, is hereby repealed. Repeal.

2 The Governor in Council may prescribe by Regulations made under the said Act the conditions upon which imported Sheep may be landed, and may appoint penalties for breach of or non-compliance with any such Regulation, not exceeding in any case the sum of Five Pounds; and any such penalty may be recovered under *The Magistrates Summary Procedure Act*. Regulations for
