

#### ANALYSIS.

1. Short title.

2. Appropriation of £92,429 18s. 8d.

AN ACT supplementary to the Acts for appro- 1924 priating certain Sums arising from the Consolidated Revenue to the Service of the State of Tasmania for the Year ended the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four.

[14 January, 1925.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Supplementary Appropriation Short title Act, 1923-24."

Appropriation of £92,429 18s. 8d.

2 The sum of Ninety-two thousand four hundred and twenty-nine Pounds Eighteen Shillings and Eight Pence, which has been issued from the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Tasmania for the service of the year ended the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, for the several purposes specified in the schedule to this Act shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the passing of "The Appropriation Act, 1923-24," for the purposes and services expressed in the schedule to this Act.
