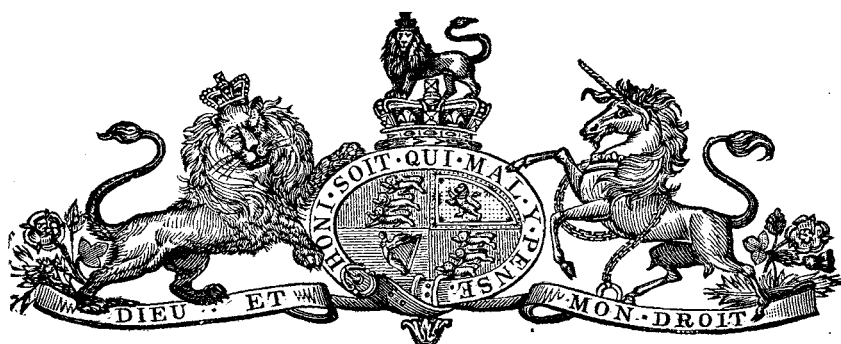

AN ACT to make further provision for A.D. 1898.
regulating the Size of Cases used in the
sale of Fruit. [15 October, 1898.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as “The Standard Fruit Case Act, 1898.” Short title.

2 In addition to the Standard Fruit Case defined by “The Standard Fruit Case Act, 1890,” a Bushel Case for use in the sale and delivery of Fruit may be a Case measuring Ten inches by Fifteen inches by Twenty inches on the outside, and containing not less than Two thousand four hundred and thirty-eight cubic inches of interior space; and a Half-bushel Case may be a Case measuring Ten inches by Seven and seven-eighth inches by Twenty inches on the outside, and containing not less than One thousand two hundred and nineteen cubic inches of interior space.
