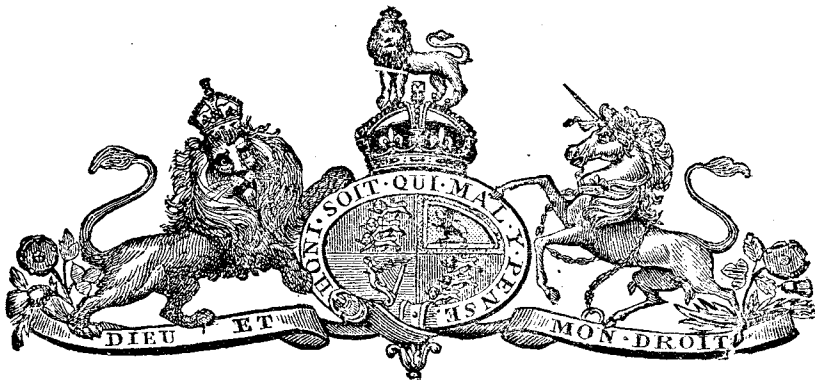

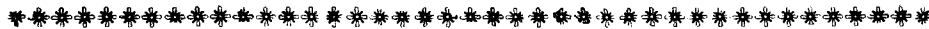

AN ACT to amend the Scottsdale Lighting Act, 1920. A.D. 1928.  
[7 January, 1929.]

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as “ The Scottsdale Lighting Act, Short title. 1928.”

(2) The Scottsdale Lighting Act, 1920, is hereinafter called “ the Principal Act.” Principal Act.

**2** Upon the passing of a special resolution for that purpose before or after the passing of this Act, in pursuance of the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1906, it shall be lawful for the Council, on behalf of the Corporation, to borrow, under the provisions of the State Loans to Local Bodies Act, 1921, any sum or sums of money, not exceeding in the whole the sum of Three thousand Pounds, in addition to any amounts previously borrowed, for the purpose of carrying out the objects of the Principal Act.

Sinking fund.

**3** The amount payable by the Council as an annual contribution towards a sinking fund in respect of any moneys borrowed under this Act shall be a sum equal to Two Pounds per centum of the moneys so borrowed.

**4** It shall be lawful for the Treasurer to borrow, raise, and receive a total sum not exceeding Three thousand Pounds for the purposes of this Act.
