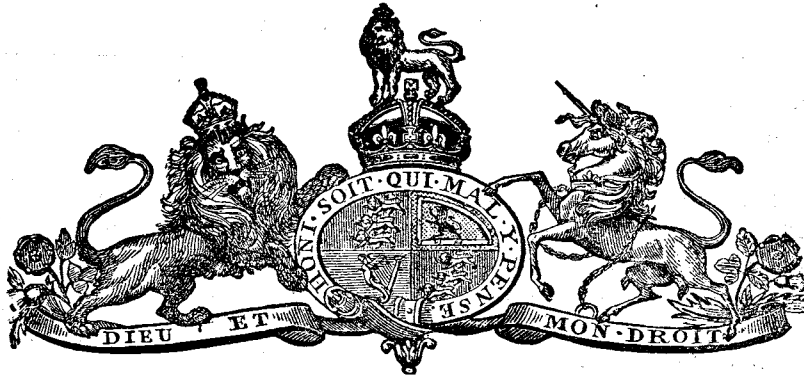

AN ACT relating to the Surplus Revenue of ^{A.D.} 1907.
the Financial Year ended on the Thirtieth
day of *June*, One thousand nine hundred and
seven. [18 *July*, 1907.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as “The Surplus Revenue Act, 1907,” and shall be deemed and taken to have come into operation on the Thirtieth day of *June*, One thousand nine hundred and seven. Short title and commencement.

2—(1.) Notwithstanding anything contained in “The Audit Act, 1901,” there shall and may be appropriated, issued, and applied, in the manner hereinafter provided, out of the excess of receipts on account of the Consolidated Revenue over expenditure out of the Consolidated Revenue, of the year ended on the Thirtieth day of *June*, 1 Ed. VII. No. 15. Application of portion of surplus for 1906-7, namely £20,000

Surplus Revenue.

One thousand nine hundred and seven, the sum of Twenty thousand Pounds for the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule to this Act.

To be credited to a separate account.

(2.) The said sum of Twenty thousand Pounds shall be paid into and credited forthwith by the Treasurer of *Tasmania* to a separate account in the books of the Treasury, to be called "The Surplus Revenue, 1906-7, Trust Fund," in this Act referred to as "the said Fund."

And then to be deemed expenditure to that amount on account of year 1906-7.

(3.) Upon the said sum being so credited it shall be deemed to be an expenditure to that amount on account of the year ended on the Thirtieth day of *June*, One thousand nine hundred and seven, and the said Treasurer may charge the same accordingly in a lump sum as expenditure in his accounts for that year.

Treasurer may issue and apply moneys.

3 The said Treasurer is hereby authorised and empowered to issue and apply the moneys so paid into the said Fund as aforesaid for the purposes and services set forth in the said Schedule.

Fund to be available for purposes in Schedule.

4 The said Fund shall be available to satisfy the Warrants under the hand of the Governor in respect of any purposes and services set forth in the said Schedule.

Credit to be given the Treasurer in his accounts.

5 The said Treasurer shall be allowed credit in his accounts, relating to the said Fund, for any sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any such Warrant as aforesaid; and the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same are so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sums as are therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

Accounts to be subject to "The Audit Act, 1901."

6 The accounts of the said fund shall be subject to the provisions of "The Audit Act, 1901," so far as such provisions are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act.

Statement of expenditure to be submitted annually to Parliament.

7 A statement of the expenditure in connection with the said fund, classified and arranged in accordance with the said Schedule, shall be submitted annually to Parliament by the Treasurer until the accounts of the said fund are closed.
