AN ACT to vest the Streets of Stauley in the

AN ACT to vest the Streets of Stauley in the 1913.

Municipal Council of Circular Head, and to ensure the better alignment thereof.

[24 December, 1913.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Stanley Streets Act."

Short title.

2 In this Act the following words and expressions shall have and Interpretation. include the following meanings attached thereto respectively:—

"The Minister" shall mean the Minister for Lands and Works for the State of Tasmania for the time being:

"The Council" shall mean the Municipal Council of Circular Head

3 The streets of Stanley shall be and the same are hereby vested Vesting of streets in the Council,

Stanley Streets.

Power to Council to align streets.

4 The Council is hereby empowered, with the approval of the Minister, to make provision for the alignment of the said streets in accordance with the plan deposited by the Council with the Minister, and for that purpose to sell such portion of the said streets or to purchase such lands as may be necessary to effect the alignment of the said streets in accordance with the said plan.

Application of purchase-money.

5 All purchase-moneys to be received by the Council for the sale of any portion of the said streets shall be applied towards the improvement of the streets of Stanley or for the purchase of land under Section Four of this Act.
