

# AN ACT to amend the Traffic Act, 1925. [14 December, 1931.]

A.D, **1931.** 

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Traffic Act, 1931."

Amendment of 16 Geo V. No. 38. 21 Geo. V. No. 52. 2 The Traffic Act, 1925 is hereby amended—

- I. By adding after Paragraph xix. of Section Thirty thereof, as enacted by the Traffic Act (No. 2), 1930, the following new Paragraph xx.:—
  - "xx. Provide for and regulate an appeal to a judge of the Supreme Court from any decision of the Committee in respect of an application made as provided by Section Sixteen, but such appeal shall be upon some question of law only, and the decision of the judge thereon shall be final and conclusive.":
- II. By expunging Paragraph v. of Subsection (2) of Section Fifty-seven thereof and substituting the following new Paragraph v.:—
  - "v. A person nominated by such organisations, representative of users of motor-vehicles, as the Governor shall think fit.": and
- III. By inserting after the word "Association" in the first line of Subsection (3) of Section Fifty-seven thereof the words "and of such organisations as aforesaid respectively."
- 3 Any person who has made an application to the Committee, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, for a licence for a public vehicle, shall have, within such time and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed, a right of appeal, in accordance with the regulations, against the decision of the Committee in relation to the appli-

4 Section Three of the Traffic Act, 1930, is hereby amended by deleting the word "one" at the end of the last line thereof and substituting therefor the word "two."
