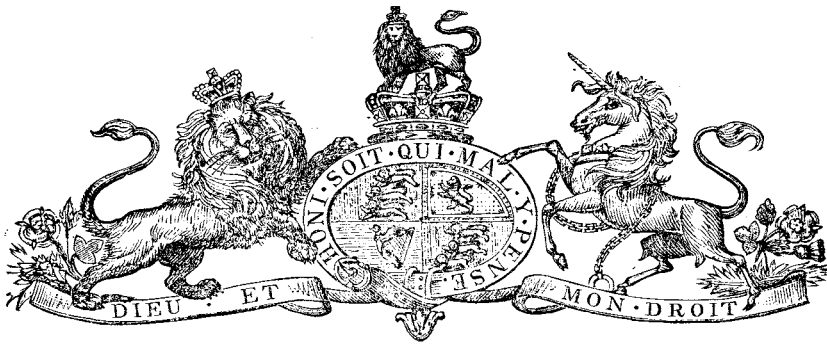

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AN ACT to Grant a Sum of Money, and to authorise the granting of a Lease of a Portion of the Queen's Domain, to "The *Tasmanian* International Exhibition Association," and for other purposes.

A.D. 1892.

[21 December, 1892.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

PREAMBLE.

1 This Act may be cited for all purposes as "The *Tasmanian* Exhibition Act."

Short title.

2 In this Act, unless the context otherwise determines, the following words and terms shall have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them; that is to say,—

Interpretation.

"The Association" shall mean "The *Tasmanian* International Exhibition Association, Limited," being a Company duly registered in *Tasmania* under the provisions of The Companies Acts, 1869 and 1883, and the successors and assigns of such Association:

"The Treasurer" shall mean the Treasurer of *Tasmania* for the time being:

"The Minister" shall mean the Minister of Lands and Works for the time being.

Sum of money to be paid to the Association on certain conditions.

**3** There shall be paid and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund during the years 1893 and 1894 to the Association any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of Six thousand Pounds: Provided always, that before any sum or sums of money shall be paid by the Treasurer under this Act or any other Act the Association shall furnish to the Treasurer, or to such officer as he may appoint, satisfactory proof of the amount of money which has been subscribed and paid by the Shareholders to and towards the capital of the Company and expended in a *bonâ fide* manner in and about the carrying out of the objects of the Association as set forth in the Memorandum and Articles of Association of the Association; and on receipt by the Treasurer of such satisfactory proof he shall pay to the Association such sum or sums of money as shall be equal to the amount which has been subscribed and paid by the Shareholders to and towards the capital of the Company and expended as aforesaid; and upon the payment by the Treasurer of the sum of Six thousand Pounds as aforesaid no further payment shall be made by the Treasurer to the Association.

Minister may issue Lease of portion of *Queen's* Domain.

**4**—(1.) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any Act, it shall be lawful for the Minister, with the consent of the Governor in Council, to grant a Lease to the Association of such portion of the *Queen's* Domain as is described in the Schedule hereto, at a peppercorn rent, for a term not exceeding Three years from the First day of *January*, 1893.

(2.) Any such Lease shall contain such conditions, provisoes, and stipulations as the Minister shall think fit to insert therein, but such Lease shall contain a condition for the forfeiture of such Lease in case the land thereby leased ceases in the opinion of the Minister to be used for the purposes of carrying out the objects of the Association. That plans and specifications of the buildings and erections to be placed on the land shall be submitted to the Minister, whose approval shall be obtained before putting up such buildings and erections; also a condition that no buildings of a permanent character shall be erected on the said land. That all buildings and erections shall be removed from the land within Three months of the termination of the lease. That the land shall, as near as possible, be restored to the same condition as before the granting of the said Lease.

(3.) During the continuance of any such Lease the land thereby leased to the Association shall cease to be subject to any of the provisions of "The *Queen's* Domain Committee Act, 1889," or to any Regulations made thereunder.

Roads through land leased to be closed.

**5** From and after the day on which such Lease as aforesaid shall be granted to the Association, any road through and across the land thereby leased shall for the time being cease to be a public and common highway and thoroughfare, and may be enclosed in such manner as may be deemed expedient:

Provided always, that before any portion of the said land is enclosed as aforesaid the Association shall construct at their own expense such road or roads in and through the *Queen's* Domain in lieu of any road closed as aforesaid, and also all convenient roads, approaches, and means of access to the *Queen's* Battery and the portion of the *Queen's* Domain lying to the south of the said *Queen's* Battery.

All such roads, approaches, and means of access shall be constructed

to the satisfaction of the Minister, or any officer appointed by him, and in such place and manner as he may from time to time direct. A.D. 1892.

**6** The Act of the Parliament, intituled "An Act to prohibit the driving of Animals and Carts through the *Queen's Domain*," shall not apply to carts, waggons, or other vehicles driven to or from the land leased to the Association. Provisions of 31 Vict. No. 2 not to apply to carts, &c.

**7** The Association may from time to time make, repeal, and alter such Rules and Regulations as they may think fit, for the purpose of providing for— Association may make Rules and Regulations.

- i. The due management of the affairs of the Exhibition in its several Departments.
- ii. The temporary admission or exclusion of the public or any individual to or from the ground leased by the Minister, or any part thereof, or to or from any building erected on such ground, and the behaviour to be observed therein.
- iii. And for fixing, altering, and regulating the charges for admission to the land included in the said lease.

All such Rules and Regulations shall be affixed in some conspicuous place or places in or about such ground, or in or about any building erected on such ground.

And every person who shall be guilty of a breach or contravention of any such Rules or Regulations shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds.

All offences against any such Rules or Regulations shall be heard and determined in a summary way by and before any Two Justices of the Peace, in the mode prescribed by *The Magistrates Summary Procedure Act*. 19 Vict. No. 8.

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## SCHEDULE.

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### AREA—10A. 3R. 27P.

Bounded on the south by 240 feet or thereabouts easterly along portion of the Domain commencing at a point on the east side of the road from Macquarie-street to Government House distant 40 feet or thereabouts north-westerly from the Main Line Railway fence, on the south west by 120 feet or thereabouts south-easterly also along portion of the Domain, on the south east by 650 feet or thereabouts north-easterly also along portion of the Domain, along the Queen's Battery, and again along portion of the Domain, on the north east by 710 feet or thereabouts north-westerly also along portion of the Domain, on the north by 130 feet or thereabouts westerly also along portion of the Domain to a new accommodation road to the Shipyards, and thence by that road and the first-mentioned road to the point of commencement.
