

********************* AN ACT to amend an Act intituled an Act to 1926.

incorporate and endow the Tasmanian

Museum and Botanical Gardens.

[21 December, 1926.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:

1-(1) This Act may be cited as "The Tasmanian Museum and Short title. Botanical Gardens Act, 1926."

(2) The Act intituled "An Act to incorporate and endow the Principal Act. Tasmanian Museum and Botanical Gardens" is herein called "the 49 Vict. No. 34 Principal Act."

Tasmanian Museum and Botanical Gardens.

Repeal of Sections $\hat{\theta}$ and 7 of the Principal Act, and substitution of new sections. Constitution of board of trustees.

2 Sections Six and Seven of the Principal Act are hereby repealed, and the following sections substituted therefor:—

"6-(1) After the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty seven, the trustees shall consist of—

- I. Six persons, being members of the Council of the Royal Society, to be elected in each year by that Council, in such manner as the Council shall determine, at its first meeting to be held after the annual meeting of the Royal Society in such year, and such persons shall hold office until their successors are elected:
- 11. One other person to be appointed by the Governor, who shall hold office during the Governor's pleasure, and who is hereinafter referred to as "the Crown trustee."

Chairman.

(2) The trustees shall, in each year, at their first meeting after their election, appoint one of their number to be chairman of the trustees, who shall hold office as such chairman until his successor is appointed.

(3) If the chairman is absent from any meeting of the trustees at the time appointed for the holding thereof, the trustees present shall appoint one of their number to act as chairman at such meeting.

(4) Subject to this Act, the trustees shall regulate their own procedure.

(5) If the Crown trustee shall at any time be temporarily unable from any cause to perform his duties as such trustee, he may, by writing under his hand, to be forwarded to the chairman, appoint some person to act as his substitute during such temporary absence, and until such appointment is revoked by notice in writing under the hand of the Crown trustee forwarded to the chairman, such substitute may, during the continuance of such appointment, exercise all the powers and authorities which, but for such appointment, could have been exercised by the person making the same.

Quorum, and casting vote of chairman.

- "7 At each meeting of the trustees, three trustees shall form a quorum, and all questions shall be decided by a majority of the trustees present; and in the case of an equality of votes the chairman shall have a casting vote."
- 3 The Principal Act may hereafter be cited as "The Tasmanian Museum and Botanical Gardens Act, 1885."
