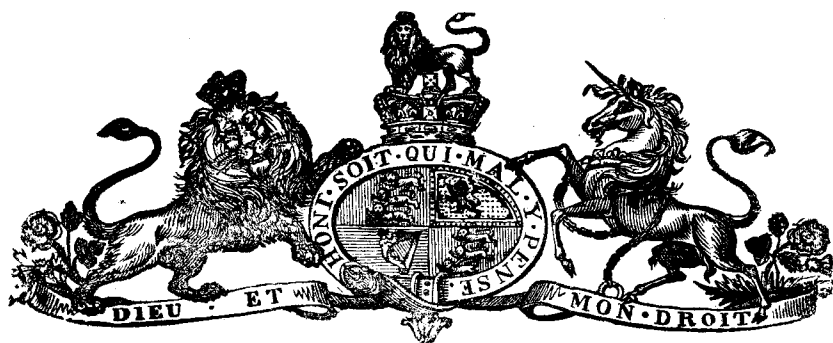

AN ACT to make provision for the Marine Survey of the West Coast of Tasmania. A.D. 1881.

[8 November, 1881.]

WHEREAS it is expedient that a Marine Survey of the West Coast of Tasmania shall be made upon the terms set forth in the Despatch of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, addressed to His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania on the 5th of June, 1878: PREAMBLE.

And whereas it has been agreed between the Imperial Government and the Government of Tasmania that the proportion of the cost of such Survey to be borne by the Government of Tasmania shall be a sum not exceeding Five thousand Pounds, and it is necessary to provide for defraying such cost:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 A proportion of the cost of a Marine Survey of the West Coast of Tasmania to be made upon the terms set forth in the Despatch of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, addressed to His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania on the 5th June, 1878, not exceeding Five thousand Pounds, shall be borne by this Colony, and shall be defrayed out of the moneys to be hereafter provided by Parliament. Defrayment of cost of Marine Survey of West Coast of Tasmania.

2 This Act may be cited as "The West Coast of Tasmania Survey Act." Short title.
