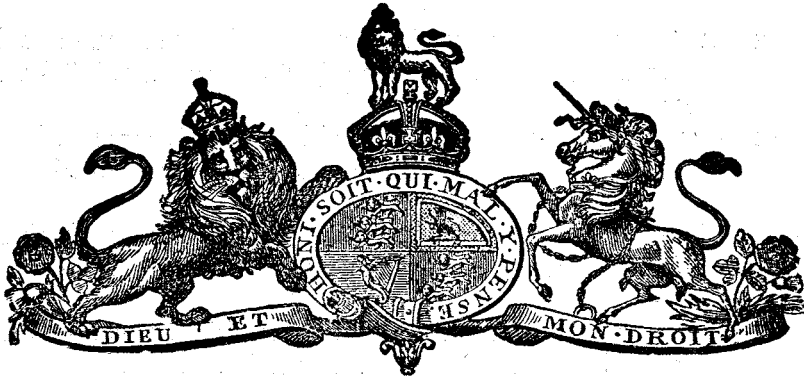

AN ACT to prevent the Use by Unauthorised ^{A.D.} **1921.**
 Persons of certain War Terms.
 [21 September, 1921.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

- 1** This Act may be cited as “The War Terms Act, 1921.” Short title.
- 2** In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires— Definition.
 - “Prohibited word” means—
 - i. The word “Anzac” or any word resembling the word “Anzac”; or

- ii. The word or expression "Aussie," "returned soldier," "returned sailor," "digger," "repatriation," "Australian Imperial Force," "A.I.F.": or
- iii. Any word or expression declared by the Governor, by notification in the "Gazette," to be a prohibited word.

Use of prohibited word.

3—(1) Any person who, unless he shall have first obtained the authority of the Attorney-General, proof whereof shall lie upon the person accused—

- i. Assumes or uses a prohibited word in connection with any trade, business, calling, or profession : or
- ii. Uses a prohibited word as the name or part of the name of—
 - (a) Any private residence ; or
 - (b) Any boat or vehicle ; or
 - (c) Any charitable or other institution or any building in connection therewith—

shall be guilty of an offence, and upon conviction before a police magistrate in a summary proceeding under "The Justices' Procedure Act, 1919," shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One hundred Pounds or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding Three months or to both penalty and imprisonment, or if the offender be a corporation, to a penalty not exceeding Two hundred Pounds.

(2) Without limiting the generality of the last preceding subsection a word or expression shall be deemed to be assumed or used by a person in connection with any trade, business, calling, or profession if—

- i. It is applied to any goods manufactured, produced, sold, or offered for sale by that person : or
- ii. It is used as the name or part of the name of any firm or company registered in Tasmania.
