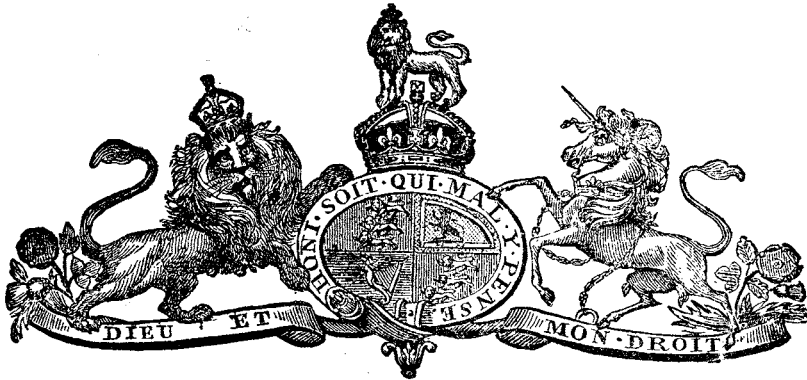

AN ACT to provide for the Application of
 the Moneys Granted by the Commonwealth
 to this State for the Payment to Wheat
 Growers. [4 January, 1935.]

WHEREAS by the *Wheat Growers Relief Act (No. 2)*
 1934 of the Commonwealth it is enacted that the sum of three
 thousand pounds shall be granted by the Commonwealth by
 way of financial assistance to this State, and that that sum
 shall be so granted upon condition that it is used by the State
 for the payment to wheat growers as provided by the Common-
 wealth Act:

Preamble.

Wheat Growers Relief.

- A.D. 1934. — Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—
- Short title. **1** This Act may be cited as the *Wheat Growers Relief Act* 1934.
- Interpretation. **2** In this Act—
 “ The Commonwealth Act ” means the *Wheat Growers Relief Act (No. 2)* 1934 of the Commonwealth:
 “ The Suspense Account ” means the account kept pursuant to section three.
- Wheat Growers Relief Suspense Account. **3**—(1) Upon the commencement of this Act, there shall be opened and kept in the books of the Treasury an account to be called “ The Wheat Growers Relief Suspense Account.”
 (2) There shall be paid and credited to the Suspense Account all moneys received by this State under the provisions of the Commonwealth Act.
- Application of moneys. **4** The amount standing to the credit of the Suspense Account shall be paid by the Treasurer to wheat growers, as may be prescribed, upon the certificate of the Director of Agriculture, and in accordance with the provisions of the Commonwealth Act and the regulations thereunder.
- Regulations. **5** The Governor may make regulations for the purposes of this Act.
