# A BILL

to amend the Fisheries Act 1968 to impose new penalties in relation to offences relating to abalone and for other purposes.

## Fisheries (Abalone Licences Penalties) Act 1991

The Parliament of Victoria enacts as follows:

### 1. Purpose

The purpose of this Act is to amend the Fisheries Act 1968 in relation to offences relating to abalone.

#### 5 2. Commencement

This Act comes into operation immediately after the Fisheries (Abalone Licences Transfer Charges) Act 1991 comes into operation.

## 3. Impost on compulsory transfer of abalone licence

In section 13A (9) of the **Fisheries Act 1968** after paragraph (b) **insert**—

## 4. Penalty for certain offences relating to abalone

- (1) In section 76B (1) of the Fisheries Act 1968—
  - (a) omit "and" after paragraph (b);
  - (b) Paragraph (c) is repealed.
- (2) After section 76B of the Fisheries Act 1968 insert—

## "76c. Compulsory transfer of abalone licence

- (1) This section applies if the holder of an abalone licence—
  - (a) is convicted of an offence relating to the taking or having possession of abalone in contravention of this Act, the regulations or a fisheries notice; and
  - (b) has been convicted (whether before or after the commencement of section 4 of the Fisheries (Abalone Licences Penalties)
    Act 1991) of such an offence on at least 2 previous occasions.

- (2) The court must upon convicting the holder of the abalone licence make an order that—
  - (a) the holder of the abalone licence is prohibited from diving for abalone; and

- (b) the holder of the abalone licence must apply to the Director-General to transfer the abalone licence within 6 months of the date of the order.
- (3) If the holder of the abalone licence does not comply with the order, the abalone licence is forfeited to the Director-General.".
