EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

- Clause 1 sets out the purposes of the Act.
- Clause 2 provides for the Act to come into operation on a day or days to be proclaimed.
- Clause 3 states that the State Concessions Act 1986 is the Principal Act.
- Clause 4 makes amendments to the Principal Act.
 - 4 (a) inserts a definition of 'subordinate instrument'.
- 4 (b) provides for the term 'eligible pensioner' as defined in the Principal Act to be used in subordinate instruments as well as in Acts.
- 4 (c), (d), (e) and (f) update references to the Commonwealth Social Security Act 1947.
- 4 (g) provides a definition of 'eligible recipient'. This is a person who is an 'eligible pensioner' or a Totally and Permanently Incapacitated Veteran.
- 4 (h) provides for the term 'eligible beneficiary' as defined in the Principal Act to be used in subordinate instruments as well as in Acts.
- 4 (i) expands the definition of 'eligible beneficiary' to include Totally and Permanently Incapacitated Veterans.
- 4 (j) updates a reference to the Commonwealth Social Security Act 1947 in the Principal Act.
- 4 (k) changes 'eligible pensioner' to 'eligible recipient' in items 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 9, 10 and 12 of the schedule to the Principal Act.
- Clauses 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 update references to Commonwealth Acts in the Accident Compensation Act 1985, the Community Welfare Services Act 1970, the Constitution Act 1975 the Landlord and Tenant Act 1958, the Magistrates (Summary Proceedings) Act 1975, the Maintenance Act 1965 and the Mental Health Act 1986.
