EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

- Clause 1 sets out the purpose of the Act.
- Clause 2 sets out the commencement provisions.
- Clause 3 provides that the Supreme Court Act 1958 is called the Principal Act.

PART 2—VALIDATION OF NEW COURT RULES

Clause 4 validates the General Rules of Procedure in Civil Proceedings conditionally made by the Judges of the Supreme Court on 18 March 1986.

Clause 5 makes certain amendments to the Court's rule-making power consequential upon validation.

PART 3—AMENDMENTS CONSEQUENTIAL ON NEW COURT RULES

Clause 6 makes certain consequential amendments.

Paragraph (a) makes certain amendments which will ensure that the new Rules of Procedure over ride any contrary provision in another Act or subordinate or other instrument.

Paragraph (b) removes the distinction between court and chambers.
