AN ACT to authorise the raising of a sum of Four million eight hundred thousand pounds by Loan for the construction of certain Public Works and Other Services and the Re-appropriation of certain Loan moneys.

[Assented to 28th December, 1928.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to authorise the raising, by way of Loan, of certain sums of money amounting in all to Four million eight hundred thousand pounds for the several purposes hereinafter mentioned, and the Reappropriation of certain Loan moneys : Be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

Power to raise money for certain purposes.

Sums raised, how to be applied.

1. This Act may be cited for all purposes as the Loan Act, 1928.

2. It shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, to raise by way of loan such several sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of Four million eight hundred thousand pounds, as may be required for the several works and purposes mentioned in the First Schedule to this Act.

3. All sums by this Act authorised to be raised shall be paid to the Treasurer, and shall be by him placed to the credit of an account to be called the General Loan Fund, and shall be applied by the Treasurer to the purposes set forth in this Act, in such amounts and manner as the Governor by any warrants under his hand may from time to time authorise and direct, in conformity with the annual Estimates of the expenditure of Loan moneys sanctioned by Parliament. 4. The principal moneys, and interest thereon, raised Principal and under the authority of this Act shall rank pari passu with on Rovenue. the principal moneys and interest raised and secured by the Stock created and sold under the Loan Act, 1891, and all subsequent Loan Acts, and are hereby charged upon and shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund and Assets of the Government of Western Australia.

The Governor may, from time to time, by warrant Advances on 5. under his hand, authorise the Treasurer to advance and apply to the purposes set forth in the Schedule to this Act any sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum hereby authorised to be raised; and any sums of money so advanced and paid shall be retained by the Treasurer out of any moneys coming to his hands under the authority of this Act.

It shall be lawful for the Governor to appropriate out Re-appropriation from and to 6. of the sum set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, from the items therein set forth, and to the items enumerated in the Third Schedule hereto, the sum of Forty-eight thousand five hundred and seventy-three pounds nine shillings and sevenpence to be expended on the works named in the Third Schedule hereto.
