AN ACT to change the dedication of portions of Permanent Reserves numbered $\frac{A\wedge}{883}$ and $\frac{A\wedge}{7686}$ and to authorise the sale of portions of Bunbury Town Lots 122 and 352.

[Assented to 16th February, 1911.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Permanent Reserves Act*, 1911. Short title.

2. All that piece or parcel of land described in the First Schedule hereto, being a portion of the permanent reserve numbered $\frac{A\wedge}{883}$ situate in the Claremont Municipal District and dedicated to the purpose of public recreation, is hereby excised from the said reserve and included in reserve numbered \wedge 5795 (School reserve).

3. All that piece or parcel of land described in the Second Schedule hereto, being a portion of the permanent reserve numbered $\frac{A \wedge}{7686}$, situate at the Upper Margaret River Bridge, and dedicated to the purpose of park lands, is hereby excised from the said reserve and shall cease to be dedicated to the said purpose, and may be disposed of under and subject to the provisions of the Land Act, 1898.

4. It shall be lawful for the Municipality of Bunbury to sell—
- (a.) The Northern moiety of Bunbury Town Lot 122, and
 - (b.) All that portion of Bunbury Town Lot 352 situated North of a straight line extending West from the South-West corner of the Northern moiety of Bunbury Town Lot 122, to the Western boundary of Bunbury Town Lot 352, and now with other lands vested in the said municipality in trust for public recreation and to transfer the same to the purchaser in fee simple discharged from the said trust:

Provided that the proceeds of sale shall be applied by the said municipality to the improvement of the said recreation ground.

THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

All that piece or parcel of land being portion of Reserve $\frac{A\Lambda}{883}$ bounded by lines starting from a point situate $359^{\circ} 49' 70 \frac{6}{10}$ links from the South-West corner of Melville Suburban Lot 82, and extending $359^{\circ} 49' 4$ chains $29 \frac{4}{10}$ links; thence $269^{\circ} 55' 1$ chain; thence $179^{\circ} 49' 2$ chains $61 \frac{4}{10}$ links; and thence $149^{\circ} 5' 1$ chain $95 \frac{7}{10}$ links to the starting point, and containing an area of 1 rood $15 \frac{2}{10}$ perches.

THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

That piece or parcel of land being portion of Reserve $\frac{A\Lambda}{7686}$ and containing one thousand acres, bounded on the South and East by lines extending West 100 chains and North 100 chains from a point situated 50 chains East of the 24-mile post on the Karridale-Busselton Road; the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal.
